A Dhaka court yesterday ordered former prime minister Sheikh Hasina and the five other accused in the MiG-29 warplane purchase graft case to appear before it on August 20.

The court rejected petitions for discharging Hasina and the other

accused from the case. Judge Golam Mortuza Majumder of the Special Judge's Court, Dhaka Division, also set August 20 for its decision whether to frame charges in the case.

The court relieved late army chief Gen (retd) Mustafizur Rahman, another accused in the case, of all charges. Gen Mustafiz died on August 3.

For the first time in the country's history, tax and wealth statements, and police records of people's representatives elected to city corporations and municipalities will be checked by the National Board of Revenue (NBR) and the police department.

All sorts of documents submitted during the electoral process by the newly elected local govern-

ment officials will be sent to the NBR and to the office of inspector general of police (IGP) for scrutiny, the sources said.

According to the electoral rules, candidature of an elected representative to city corporations and municipalities might be cancelled if the representative had submitted false information or suppressed Informed by different sources any information regarding finan-

If the candidature of a mayor or said. councillor elect is cancelled, his or her election to the post will automatically be cancelled even after taking the oath of office, senior officials in the EC Secretariat said.

The rules also have a provision of filing criminal cases with courts instead, against any elected representative, if the person is accused of violating electoral rules.

Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) ATM Shamsul Huda already declared that legal actions will be taken against violators of electoral rules, even if they are elected.

Upon directives from the EC, its secretariat yesterday completed all preparations to send relevant documents to the NBR and to the office of IGP today, the sources

The EC in its draft letter, to be sent to the NBR and IGP today, sought separate opinions on each of the elected officials, after scrutiny of their records that fall under the jurisdictions of the two government authorities.

HC stayed tax evasion case proceedings against Tarique

The High Court (HC) yesterday stayed for three months the proceedings of a tax evasion case filed by the National Board of Revenue (NBR) against detained BNP Senior Joint Secretary General Tarique Rahman.

Responding to a writ petition filed by Tarique, an HC bench comprised of Justice ABM Khairul Haque and Justice Md Abu Tariq also issued a rule upon the government to explain within six weeks why the initiation and continuation of this case should not be declared illegal.

Meanwhile, the chamber judge of the Appellate Division Justice MA Matin sent a petition filed by Tarique Rahman -- for staying the proceedings against him in the Tk 21-crore bribery case involving the murder of Bashundhara Group director Humayun Kabir Sabbir -to the regular bench of the Appellate Division for hearing.

The chamber judge also fixed August 17 for the hearing at the apex court.

Draft coal policy for Mine Bangla

Proposal goes to cabinet today

The eighth draft coal policy that emphasises immediate government-led action in coal sector to meet the country's surging energy demand is likely to be placed before the caretaker government's cabinet today.

The draft proposes to set up a "mine Bangla" in line with Petrobangla by 2010 to spearhead different mining schemes. This government body will take strategic partners from private sector through open tenders for quick development of the schemes.

Other proposals include compulsory release of 20 percent shares of a mining venture to the local market as per the laws of the Securities Exchange Commission. When selling back, shareowners will be only able to sell those to the government at market price.

"Because of excessive revisions and inputs from a wide number of people, the draft policy now sounds more like a law than a policy," says a source. "And this was exactly the observation of the law

ministry about the policy when the energy ministry sent the draft to the law ministry a few months

The draft policy tries to touch almost all aspects of coal development. "That is why the law ministry observed that instead of such a policy, the government should work on several laws instead of just one," the source adds. The coal policy was first drafted

in December 2005. The seventh draft was prepared by a committee to review the draft policy. Headed by former VC of Buet Prof Abdul Matin Patwari, the 10-member committee submitted its report to the energy ministry in December The ministry itself has also modi-

fied some of the contents. Only recently, the ministry has forwarded the draft to the Cabinet Division for approval by the cabinet.

Under this policy, private companies will not have sole ownership over any coal mining deal and must come as partners with a national coalmining company.

Detained former prime minister Khaleda Zia has taken a firm stand that she will neither apply to the caretaker government seeking release nor accept parole. "The government has arrested

me and it is the government's duty to free me. Cases against me are all politically motivated. I will not apply for release, I want to be freed with honour," she was quoted by her lawyers as saying. Khaleda's lawyers Ahmed Azam

Khan and Shimul Biswas met her at the makeshift jail in the parliament complex yesterday and had nearly a 45-minute conversation with her. Emerging from the meeting,

Advocate Azam Khan told the news agency that Khaleda Zia expressed concern over delay in sending her son Tarique Rahman abroad for treatment.

Of the seven, BNP leaders Khandaker Mosharraf, Pintu, ex-BRTC chairman Taimur Alam Khandaker, Awami League (AL) leaders Kamal Majumder and Sheikh Mohammad Abdullah, and former prime minister Khaleda Zia's brother Shamim Iskander are detained in graft and extortion cases while former assistant secretary RAM Obaidul Muktadir Chowdhury on charges of violating the emergency power rules.
