

Bangladeshi documentary "... And We Cross the Same Road", directed by Shabnam Ferdousi and produced by Impress Telefilm Ltd, was screened at the 4th Globians Documentary Film Festival 2008 in Potsdam, Germany on August 12, according to a press release.

Only five films were selected from Asia among 150 Films from 40 countries and Ferdousi was the only Bangladeshi filmmaker invited to the Festival to present her film. The film portrays a number of street beggars in Dhaka and thereby explores the less known circle of exploitation of the poorest among the poor in the city. The film was highly appreciated at the
