



Wari-Bateshwar: In search of origins

Lecture at Chhayanat



The history of human race is about 24,00,000 years old, but it was not until 10,000 years back that humans started making settlements. As the pre-historic people mostly lived in stone-caves, it is commonly thought that there cannot possibly be any trace of humans from that period in Bangladesh. But archaeological excavation of the Wari-Bateshwar site in Narsingdi district indicates just the opposite. Wari-Bateshwar, two neighbouring sites on the Pleistocene flat surface of the eastern Madhupur tract proves the existence of an ancient fort-city (dating back to the year 450 BC) on the bank of the river Buriganga.

Chhayanat arranged a lecture

on Wari-Bateshwar at the Chhayanat Sanskriti Bhaban on August 15. Professor Shah Sufi Mustafizur Rahman, Department of Archaeology, Jahangirnagar University, who is leading the excavation at the site since 2000, was the speaker at the event.

Dr. Sanjida Khatun, president of Chhhayanat, welcomed the audience and introduced Professor Shah Sufi Mustafizur Rahman and his team. A one-minute silence was observed in honour of Rahman.

The lecture was aided with an interesting slide show, which included maps and photographs of the site, artefacts, archaeological discoveries and different processes of excavation and survey.

Professor Rahman explained how the excavation began and how important the discovery is to our history. It is being speculated that Wari-Bateshwar is indeed "Sounagora", a centre of trade described by Ptolemy.

"The excavation owes a lot to Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur the local schoolteacher Hanif Pathan who initially played a major role in generating public interest in the sites in 1930. Later, his son Habibullah Pathan, an amateur archaeologist, furthered the mission with his writings. But it wasn't until 2000 that any formal

excavation began at the sites. Several organisations including The Daily Star came forward to promote it, as the process is timeconsuming, costly and difficult," said Professor Rahman.

"Traces of the civilisation we found at Wari-Bateshwar are astonishingly advanced. Instead of living in stone caves, here the people invented a system, which is known as "pit-dwelling" -- an important discovery of the excavation. The system indicates to the Chalcolithic era. Instead of tools

made of stones, a kind of fossil

wood was used. Artefacts, beads and household items made of clay and ceramic further ensure the authenticity of the excavation. We could not exactly trace the year of the artefacts but samples have been sent to the Institute of Archaeology, London University for "Carbon-14" test (a method to identify the time)," he added.

The lecture included descriptions of different perspectives of the excavation and its historicalarchaeological significance. A question-answer session followed the lecture.

Selim Al Deen's birth anniversary celebration begins today

Dhaka Theatre and Bangladesh Shilpakala Academy (BSA) have jointly organised a six-day elaborate programme to celebrate the 59th birth anniversary of eminent playwrighttheoretician Selim Al Deen, which begins today. The celebration programme features theatre performances, exhibition, installations, documentary film screenings and semi-

Selím Al Deen (1949-2008) -a pioneer of neo-theatre movement in Bangladesh, a theoretician of drama, a scholar, an organiser and a professor of Department of Drama and Dramatics at Jahangirnagar University -- developed a 'new drama form' based on the narratives of traditional indigenous theatre.

The programme will begin this morning with paying tributes to the grave of Selim Al Deen at Jahangirnagar University campus.

In the evening, Rasheda K. Chowdhury, adviser to the Ministry of Cultural Affairs, is expected to inaugurate the festival formally at the National Theatre Stage, BSA. Awards in memory of

Maqsudus Saleheen, Bazlut Rashid and Fawzia Yasmin Shiblee will be announced at the inauguration ceremony.

Three of Al Deen's plays --Joiboti Konyar Mon, Prachya and Nimojjon -- will be staged by Dhaka Theatre. Moreover,



the troupe will stage Binodini, five young directors. Moreover, an adaptation based on the autobiography of legendary 19th century actor Binodini Dasi under the supervision of Selim Al Deen, Other attractions are two shows of Kolkata-based theatre troupe Swapnosan dhani's productions Hargoj,

written by Selim Al Deen. The birth anniversary programme also features screening of five documentaries on Selim Al Deen, directed by

in Selim Al Deen Memorabilia, photographs and posters featuring rare moments of the legendary dramatist will be on display.

The arrangement also includes four seminars. Title of the seminars are: Selim Al Deen: Bektigato O Bektigato Chhariye, Prachya: Satya-r Khonje Natok, Dwoitadwoitobadi Shilpatatwa: Selim Al Deen O Joiboti Konyar Mon and Oitijyabahi Bangla Natyariti O Selim Al Deen.

Madonna turns 50

On August 16, 2008, the world had five decades of the Queen of Pop. And going by the way she's still kicking up those well-toned heels on stage, we can probably look forward to five decades more.

Here's a quick look at how Madonna changed the world.

Born in Michigan, USA, on August 16, 1958 (to a French Canadian mom and Italian American dad), Madonna Louise Ciccone Ritchie moved to New York as a teenager in pursuit of a career in modern dance.

She joined a couple of forgettable pop musical groups, before deciding to walk down a path of her own making. The result was a self-titled debut album that took her straight to the top, and kept her there for a very, very long time.

Considering she moved to New York with a mere \$35 in her pocket, it's easy to see why Madonna's rise to the top is so inspirational. It was allegedly the first time she took a plane, or even a taxicab. And yet, a few years after moving out of her hometown, she had a record deal with Sire Records by 1982.

With her second album, the unforgettable Like A Virgin, she conquered America. World domination would soon follow. Like A Virgin is now listed by the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame as one of the Definitive 200 Albums of All Time!

Once Madonna began, there was no stopping her. Hit albums seemed to pour out of her -- True Blue in 1986, Who's That Girl in and the second top-selling 1987, Like a Prayer in 1989, I'm Breathless and The Immaculate Collection in 1990, Erotica in 1992...and on, and on.


Madonna, however, doesn't seem to care.

She married actor Sean Penn in 1986 and divorced him three years later, after beginning a relationship with Warren Beatty. More models followed, as did a basketball player, a rapper, and fitness trainer Carlos Leon who became the father of her daughter Lourdes Leon.

Madonna met English director Guy Ritchie in 1999 and bore his son Rocco a year later, after which they decided to marry. The press has speculated about the fate of the marriage lately, but Madonna and Guy insist their life as a couple is far from over.
