



New flood forecasting tech can reduce losses

Experts say at seminar

Bangladesh can use a technology from next year that can forecast flood ten days ahead, which the experts said, would significantly reduce the losses wrought by flood, almost an annual phenomenon in

Bangladesh presently has the flood forecasting technology of 72 hours and, therefore, the new technology, which has been piloted in five districts, could be applied countrywide next year.

Officials of Bangladesh Water Development Board (BWDB) said this at a two-day seminar 'Long lead flood forecast technology for disaster management' organised by water resources ministry at a city hotelyesterday.
