



"Maybe I proved to myself that was doing the right things, and that the season was difficult and tough for me and that I maybe did pick the right schedule," he said. "I have energy left at the end of the trip. definitely came out here fresh. I'm still fresh today. I'm very happy with what my decision-making was."

He also is pleased to be heading into 2009 on a positive note.

No more "What's wrong with Roger?" questions.

"It's the end of the year, it's the last Grand Slam. He didn't have a bad year, but for his standards, not as good as he would have liked," Federer's part-time coach, Jose Higueras, said outside the locker room after Monday night's champagne celebration. "It's a great thing going into next year. It gives him a lot of hope to get ready for next season, and I think it's a great feeling for him."

Chelsea captain John Terry is confident Michael Essien will return from his knee injury in time to play a big part in their season.

The club confirmed yesterday Essien will need surgery to cure the problem and that he will be out for "several months".

It has been suggested in some quarters that the Ghana international could be out for the season, but Terry has spoken to the midfielder and revealed he may be back by February.

He said: 'I spoke to Michael. He's had a bad injury. He was say ing to me it's more like five months. It's very disappointing as Chelsea captain

Essien's absence will be a major factor when Chelsea face Manchester City - who stole Robinho from under their noses on transfer deadline day - after the international break in Saturday's 5.30pm kick-off.

Ribery set for surprise comeback

Bayern Munich midfielder Franck Ribery is hoping to play a role in next Wednesday's opening Champions League clash against Steaua Bucharest on his way back from ankle surgery.

Ribery tore ankle ligaments playing for France against Italy during Euro 2008 last June, but resumed full training with the Bayern squad on Monday and is hoping to be on the bench next week in Bucharest.

Having originally targeted the Champions League visit of Lyon to Munich on September 30 as his first game back, Ribery is now hoping to play some part in next Wednesday's clash with Steaua.

"I hope I'll at least be part of the squad," he said.

The 25-year-old then wants to play a full role in Bayern's Champions League clash with Lyon at Munich's Allianz Arena. Ribery said Saturday's trip to

face Cologne in the Bundesliga was too soon for him and he needs another two weeks of fitness work. "Obviously I'm desperate to

play, but I need another two weeks or so before I'm back to 100 per cent," he explained. "I really enjoyed being back



"HSV forever and ever," is the anthem of German Bundesliga soccer club SV Hamburg, or HSV. Now fans can be true to their team after death. Europe's first cemetery for football supporters opened Tuesday in the port city, just a stone's throw from the club's home ground, the Nordbank Arena.

fans who have left their earthly life the chance "to hear how a match has ended," said Christian Reichert, the club official responsible for fan affairs.

The cemetery, which took one year to lay out, allows deceased supporters "a feeling of being present," even after death, Reichert

Located within a larger ceme-

tery, the grave plots are modelled on a soccer stadium, with a concrete goal guarding the entrance. The grass used to be part of the Nordbank Arena's football pitch. Among the different types of

funeral services on offer is one with the club anthem played during the burial, or the use of a blue coffin painted in the diamond-shaped The undertaker who arranges

the services chose the slogan "True passion knows no final whistle" to The final resting place offers advertise his football burial pack-He also promises that the cof-

fins will be covered with "soil that

has been played on" when they are lowered into the ground. "The first funeral will take place here in the next few days," he added. There have already been 20 firm enquiries from fans ranging in

age from 28 to 80.

Eberstein, 79, says he is keen to secure a spot for himself in the fan cemetery. But one of the club's most famous players, Uwe Seeler, dislikes the idea. "If there are supporters who

want that, it's fine with me, but maybe that's a bit too much," said the former striker. There are enough plots to accommodate up to 500 fans. Club

officials say the only other ceme-

tery of its kind was opened by Argentina's Boca Juniors last year. But unlike the South American site, the Hamburg one is within close distance of the stadium. The idea came about because

Germany's strict funeral laws prohibit the scattering of ashes on playing fields as is practised in the Netherlands. Regulations also do not allow

the burial of urns along the sidelines as is possible at the ground of HSV board member Horst English Premiership club Everton.
