prime minister Khaleda Zia was freed yesterday from her yearlong detention amid huge celebration and a grand reception given by thousands of party leaders, activists and supporters.

It has already firmed up proposals for amendments to the recently revised Representation of the People Order (RPO) so the parties could make do with provisional changes to their constitutions to fulfil the conditions for registra-

However, they must give an ment. undertaking that they will ratify the

necessary amendments to the [party] constitutions at national councils within six months after formation of new parliament, EC sources said.

The EC move is part of efforts to break the impasse over registration of the political parties before the long-stalled ninth parliamentary polls tentatively planned for December.

According to its time limit, a political party must apply to the commission by October 15 for registration, now mandatory for those seeking election to parlia-
