Iftekhar urges int'l community

Foreign Adviser Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury urged the international community to face the threat of climate change in a comprehensive manner.

He said this while he was speaking at an event on "Climate Change" hosted jointly at the UN Headquarters by Bangladesh, Netherlands, Switzerland and the

UK on Wednesday. Describing climate change as a major threat to development he said adequate resources must be transferred to the more vulnerable groups of nations like the least developed countries (LDCs) in order to enable them to combat and surmount the

threat, says a press release. "The climate change debate must be 'depoliticised' and the developed and major developing countries must bear the burden of the costs incurred in transferring

the relevant technology to the poorer and more vulnerable countries", he said.

Nearly 50 ministers representing both rich and poorer countries attended the event.

Prof Jeffrey D Sachs of the Columbia University, who moderated the event, urged the rich countries to stick by the promises made if the Millennium Development Goals are to be achieved. Food Security

Another report adds: Iftekhar called upon Commonwealth countries to focus on ensuring food security for its citizens.

He was addressing the Special Commonwealth Heads of Government meeting (SCHOGM), at the United Nations Headquarters on Wednesday, says a press release.

Iftekhar suggested food exporting and importing Commonwealth countries to arrive at a "compact" to address the issue more effectively.

Plastic trader shot by extortionists STAFF CORRESPONDENT

A plastic trader was shot by the extortionists in the city's Kotwali area last night while another gang of criminals exploded several homemade bombs in front of three bus counters demanding extortions at Jatrabari.

The trader identified as Emdadul Huq Babu, 55, of Nolgola Mohsin Plaza Market, was rushed to Orthopedic Hospital with bullet

Two criminals -- Khokan and Rashid -- were arrested and a handmade bomb was recovered from their possession, police said.

Abdul Hannan, officer-in-charge of Kotwali police, said Babu was shot in his hands by a gang of five armed extortionists at about 8:30pm.

Local sources said the gun attack was made following the refusal to pay toll to the criminals. Meanwhile, at least seven home-

made bombs were exploded in front of the counters of three bus services -- Ilish Paribahan, Ananda Paribahan and Greate Bikrampur Paribahan -- at a South Jatrabari at about 9:00pm.

Police and witnesses said the extortionists exploded the bombs to create panic as they were not paid extortion money.
