Eid tomorrow if Shawal moon sighted today

Eid-ul-Fitr, the biggest religious festival of the Muslims, will be celebrated across the country tomorrow if the Shawal moon is sighted today.

If the new moon is not sighted today, the Eid will be celebrated on Thursday ending the month-long fasting of Ramadan.

Muslims in the country and the rest of the world will seek divine blessings, peace, progress and prosperity in Eid congregations.

Islamic Foundation sources said the National Moon Sighting Committee will sit at 6:45pm today to scour the sky for the Shawal moon. It will also collect information on moon sighting from the SEE PAGE 15 COL 4

HC rejects Hasina's bail prayer

The High Court (HC) yesterday rejected a bail petition filed by Awami League President Sheikh Hasina in an extortion case filed by businessman Noor Ali.

A vacation bench of the HC comprising Justice Sheikh Rezowan Ali and Justice Md Rais Uddin rejected the bail prayer on grounds that the petitioner must be present in the country for seeking bail, but she has been abroad on parole for treatment.

Meanwhile, talking to The Daily Star last evening, Additional Attorney General Mansur Habib in a surprising comment said, "The High Court's refusal to grant bail to Sheikh Hasina might have a negative impact on the current political situation, since the government has been trying to bring her and

together for a dialogue." But earlier in the day the same additional attorney general represented the government in opposing the bail prayer saying, Hasina

must be in the country for seeking bail in any case.

The former premier's counsel Barrister Rafique-ul Huq said, "The petition for bail was filed in favour of Sheikh Hasina on medical grounds, but the court did not grant her bail. The High Court has every right to grant or reject any bail petition in any case. We will file an appeal with the Supreme Court, which will then take the decision.

Petition off HC hearing list

Poll schedule with redrawn JS seats faces setback

A High Court (HC) bench yesterday dropped from its cause list a writ petition challenging the Election Commission's (EC) redemarcation of the parliamentary constituencies.

The decision that came from the vacation bench of Justice Nazmun Ara Sultana and Justice Md Rezaul Haque means an earlier HC order staying the constituency delimitation remains in force.

It also represents a setback for the EC plans to announce schedule for the national election with redrawn constituencies by the first week of November with a gap of at least 42 days between the publication of timetable and the polling day of December 18.

Counsels for the writ petitioner prayed for the hearing to be deferred till October 18. They said

CHINESE MILK POWDER

Lab test confirms melamine presence

Traces of melamine have been found in the Chinese baby formula Yashili 2 that was earlier found available in markets in some parts of the country.

Plasma Plus, the private testing laboratory, yesterday confirmed this in its report to the Bangladesh Standards and Testing Institute

The government is also taking steps to amend the breast milk substitute regulation of marketing ordinance-1984 in order to take sterner action against those who are importing unregulated milk powder that pose a threat to public health.

The testing laboratory found melamine in Yashili 2 milk powder's 8008 batch.

Director General of BSTI Azmal Hossain told The Daily Star, "The presence of harmful melamine in Yashili 2 milk formula has been found according to the report by Plasma Plus. The amount of melamine present is 72.77 milligram per kg of milk"

He said that BSTI, the Department of Chemistry of Dhaka University and Plasma Plus are scheduled to test melamine in different baby milk products following media reports of thousands of children being affected in China. Dhaka University is now closed
