Eid fails to touch monga-hit

Although a large number of last-minute Eid shoppers are cramming into markets, the festivity could not touch the poverty-striken people of the northern region of the country.

The poverty due to crises of job and food have overshadowed Eid celebration of the underprivileged hundreds, many of whom are flocking to shopping centres at district and upazila headquarters for begging alms.

During this period, the poor people usually suffer from monga, a nearfamine situation, following lack of agricultural work and food shortage.

The situation is likely to persist till the harvest in December, said the government officials, adding that the situation has however improved a bit following various government measurers.

The main buyers at Eid markets in northern region are the villagers. So the stand of holding the upazila polls traders are also facing dull markets in their absence. Most farmers and day labourers are still in severe hardships," said Mustafijur Rahman, a business-

"The markets are crowded, but the business is still low as the potential buyers are yet to come," said Rabiul Hasan, an owner of garment shop at RDAmarket.

The situation has aggravated following unaffordable prices of daily essen-

"Many of those who live at villages, especially on the shoals and banks the Padma, depend on khud (broken rice), arum and available vegetables as only foodstuffs," said Abul Kalam Azad, a union council member of Khidirpur shoal.

Miraj Hossain, a farmer of Talanda union under Tanore upazila, said he had sold his goat to buy a dress for his eight-year-old daughter.

JSD for holding UZ election under CG

A release of the French Embassy yesterday said this procedure already implemented around the world will help the bona fide visa holders to travel smoothly to the countries of Schengen areas. The generalisation of biometry

for visas issued by all Schengen States results from the decision taken by the European Council on June 8, 2004, to set out the biometric data to be operational in Europe

Heads of state, ministers and their spouses invited by the governments of the member States of Schengen area or by Intergovernmental Organisations or when they call on one Intergovernmental Organisation are exempted from this fingerprints procedure.

Members of official delegations and political personalities (Parliament Members, Leaders of Political Parties) in the same situation will be exempted.

Yet another falls victim to dowry violence

Fahima Begum, a mother of fivemonth-old boy, managed to save her child from a knife attack but could not protect herself. The attacker is none other than her husband who swooped on them failing to get dowry from his inlaws' house.

With two major stab wounds in her body, the 20-year-old woman is now undergoing treatment at Dhaka Medical College Hospital

The incident took place at their rented house at Kathgora in Savar on September 24. Other tenants caught the husband, M Kawser, in the act and have left him tied up in the house since then.

Married for four years, Fahima and Kawser used to work at sweater factories near their house, but she stopped working in December last year when she was five months pregnant. Her husband also stopped going

to factory four months ago due to selling muri (puffed rice), which he husband. continued only for two months, Fahima said, lying in her hospital

"Her intestines spilled out immediately. With the help of neighbours, I rushed her to the hospital," said her mother.

Soon after the incident, Kawser tried to escape, but the neighbours caught and tied him to a pillar of their house.

Fahima was operated upon at danger, doctors said.

"Local people asked us not to file any complaints with the police, saying that they would punish him through arbitration," the victim said, adding that she also wants




