To avoid controversy, the EC this time selected polling centres for the December 18 parliamentary polls with the help of the army, send the list of polling stations to starting the process in November last year.

November, the EC had directed its field level officials to prepare lists of prospective polling stations in their areas, get those approved by the army representatives in charge of the areas and then forward the lists to the EC.

US Senate passes Indian nuke pact

Rice in Delhi, but deal signing delayed

AFP, AP, Washington/ New Delhi The US Senate has endorsed

landmark US-India nuclear agreement, removing the final legislative hurdle for resumption of civilian nuclear trade between the two countries after three decades.

Secretary of State Condoleezza Rice arrived in the Indian capital yesterday to commemorate but not put her signature to a historic deal that opens up US nuclear trade with the Asia giant.

A signing ceremony that had been scheduled was dropped because, according to US officials, a series of administrative steps have yet to be taken in Washington following Senate approval of authorising legislation on Wednesday. Rice was meeting here with top government officials, including Prime Minister Manmohan Singh, External Affairs Minister Pranab Mukherjee and political opposition leaders.

SOARING INFLATION

Tighten belt more, suggests IMF

The International Monetary Fund (IMF) has recommended tight monetary policy to check soaring inflation, which it says poses a major challenge to the economy in Bangladesh.

But the multilateral lending agency backed what it said was the

current budget's mildly expansionary stance meant to safeguard people against the social impact of higher food prices.

"Preventing an increase in inflation is the immediate priority, as the poor and vulnerable are hit hardest by inflation," the IMF said in a report known as Article IV Consultation.
