FROM PAGE 1 Distressed global stocks endured another rollercoaster ride of rallies and losses after the devastating falls of Monday.

In New York, the Dow Jones Industrial Average rose 76.14 points to 10.031.64 in early trading one day after slumping below 10,000 for the first time in four years.

London added 0.66 percent, reversing losses from early trading, after its 7.8 percent slump Monday.

Royal Bank of Scotland shares plunged up to 40 percent as it denied reports it had sought an emergency government money. Lloyds TSB slumped 9.94 percent and Barclays 5.89 percent after the BBC reported that the three banks spoke with Chancellor of the Exchequer Darling late Monday about a possible capital

Frankfurt gained 0.82 percent and Paris 1.33 percent, in similar ups and downs, after diving 7.0 and 9.0 percent respectively on Monday.

In Asia, Tokyo fell by 3.0 percent, while Sydney jumped 1.7 percent after Australia's central bank sprang a surprise interest rate cut.

Again there was no hiding from the financial panic. Egypt's CASE-30 stockindexfell 16.5 percent.

The International Monetary Fund urged central banks to provide direct support to the banking system, saying some 657 billion dollars would be needed in the next few

The European Central Bank on Tuesday pumped 50 billion dollars (37 billion euros) back into interbank money markets, but it said banks sought more than double that

The ECB said 67 eurozone banks had requested more than 109 billion dollars, and paid a whopping 6.75 percent for dollars made available in the daily attempt to keep cash flowing through the financial pipeline.

Prices of rice witnessed a rise in the capital after the Eid vacation. In retail markets, prices of most varieties of rice wentup by Tk 1 per kg while the wholesale prices increased by Tk 20-30 per maund (37.32 kg).

Yesterday, coarse rice was selling for Tk 33 a kg at retail, Parija and Lata (varieties of rice) were selling between Tk35 and Tk37 a kg, Miniket between Tk 41 and Tk 43 and Najirshail (the best quality) between Tk45 and Tk48 a kg.

Towards the end of Ramadan and after the Eid wholesalers increased rice prices up to Tk 40 per maund, claimed a number of retailers.

By wholesale yesterday, coarse rice was selling between Tk 1,120 and Tk 1,130 per maund, BR-28 between Tk 1,220 and Tk 1,400, Parija between Tk 1,180 and Tk 1,240, Miniket between Tk 1,500 and Tk 1,520 and Najirshail between Tk 1,580 and Tk A number of rice traders at

Bangladesh is the Ganges River Dolphins. They are strange looking animals with an extraordinary long snout, a tiny dorsal fin and large flippers. They live throughout the Padma, Meghna, Jamuna, Karanaphuli and Sangurivers. Today, they are an endangered species. Irrawaddy dolphins are found in

rivers and in coastal waters that receive freshwater from rivers. They share habitat with the Gangetic dolphins in the waterways of the

Indo-Pacific humpback dolphins and finless porpoises are occasional visitors to the mangrove forest but they live mostly in open coastal waters that receive freshwater flows from the Padma, Meghna and Jamuna rivers. Spinner dolphins, Dan Tropical spotted dolphin and Omdo-Pacific bottlenose dolphins are also our sea mammals.

Sadly, all of them are today threatened by fishing and pollution, Prof Benazir Ahmed of Zoology Department of Chittagong University said.

The Swatch of No Ground, the mysterious canyon in the deep of the Bay of Bengal, is still a safe place for dolphins and whales. They can be seen in large schools there. Only a few of us have the opportunity to witness their magnificent display. In an effort to conserve whales
