Five killed in Manikganj road accident

Five people were killed and 50 others injured in a road accident at Golora in Manikganj Sadar yester-

The accident occurred at around 2:15pm when a Dhakabound bus of Sohag Paribahan from Satkhira collided head-on with a Manikganj-bound minibus of Village Line Service.

Four of the dead were identified as Shantanu Roy, 35, Dipak, 25, Rekha, 2, daughter of Raja Mia, and Mohiuddin, 40, driver of the minibus, but the identity of the other victim could not be known imme-

diately. Among the injured, 25 were rushed to Manikganj Sadar Hospital while nine of them were shifted to Dhaka Medical College their condition deteriorated.






