Students of Dhaka College and City College clashed twice over eve teasing while clashes between

DU braces for more BCL violence

Leaders of two factions fight for new hall committees

Disputes between central and midlevel Dhaka University (DU) leaders of the Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) over forming new committees for residential halls are turning for the worse.

The mid-level leaders have been pressing for the hall committees for the past three years. The proformed such committees in 2002.

BCL president Mahmud Hassan Ripon told a press conference in May that the DU hall units would be reorganised in a week.

But the central leaders, backed by the upper echelon of the university unit BCL, have since been biding their time, arguing that they should now focus on pressing for the unconditional release of Awami League President Sheikh Hasina.

Students said the disagreement between the two factions may erupt into full-bore clashes at any

Highest-ever \$1.34b WB grant pledged

UNB, Dhaka

The World Bank (WB) has committed the highest-ever assistance of \$1.34 billion to Bangladesh for the current fiscal year while the country has been elected to two committees for making the bank's Strategic Climate Change Trust Fund operational.

Finance and Planning Adviser Mirza Azizul Islam said this while talking to reporters at Zia International Airport yesterday on his return from Washington DC, where he attended the IMF-World Bank annual meetings.

Of the total assistance, \$959 million is for the July-December period of this year and the rest \$381

million for the January-June period of the next year, the adviser said.

"This is the largest ever World Bank commitment... this is due to their satisfaction over Bangladesh for various reform measures," he

He added that the positive view about Bangladesh was expressed not only by the World Bank but also by other multilateral institutions. "We could project Bangladesh and its image which has helped us gain access to additional funds." Among the July-December

assistance projects, Shiddhirganj Peaking Power Plant of \$355 million is scheduled to go to the World Bank Board for approval on

Hillary joins Obama's bid to crush McCain comeback hopes

Barack Obama yesterday aimed to put another dent in John McCain's comeback hopes with a double-bill rally in Florida with ex-foe Hillary Clinton to kick off a frenetic final fortnight of the White House race.

Obama's new offensive follows a quickfire combination of blows to Republican McCain over the weekend including a key endorsement from Colin Powell and the announcement of a stunning 150 million dollar fundraising haul last month.

The Democratic nominee will spend much of the week charging through what was nominally Republican territory, seeking to convert his lead on the electoral map and clear opinion poll edge

into a big victory over McCain on November 4. In Florida, Obama and Clinton

were to headline a joint rally and several separate events Monday, pitching for a state which had looked solid for McCain, but where a wave of mortgage foreclosures offer the Democrats an opening.

The former first lady is highly popular in the Sunshine State and trounced Obama in the Democratic primary there, but the contest was declared void after Florida violated party scheduling

McCain, 72, was meanwhile on the defensive Monday, attempting to cling onto states that helped send President George W Bush back to the White House in 2004.
