No assurance yet about Hasina's participation in polls: Zillur

Awami League's acting President Zillur Rahman yesterday said the caretaker government during Thursday's dialogue did not give them any assurance that party chief Sheikh Hasina would be able to participate in the coming general election.

Two major political parties Awami League (AL) and BNP are waiting to see the caretaker government implement the consensual agreements they reached at the last among the three.

Insiders of both parties said they want the agreements to be implemented before the announcement of the detailed election schedule on November 2.

Leaders of both parties said they especially want to hear specific

decisions coming from the military backed government regarding the state of emergency, and about participation of their chiefs Khaleda Zia and Sheikh Hasina in the election.

AL Presidium Member Tofail Ahmed said during the talks it was made clear to them that Sheikh Hasina will be allowed to contest in the election.

He told The Daily Star last night, "I call upon the government to implement the agreements immediately for the sake of creating an atmosphere conducive to holding a free and credible election."

"There is no legal or constitutional obstacle to allowing AL President Sheikh Hasina contest in the election," he said.

Leaders pledge global finance reform

World leaders vowed to overhaul the global financial system and China on Saturday urged tighter regulation after a week in which recession fears plunged stock markets into freefall.

Asian and European leaders meeting in Beijing promised wideranging and effective reforms while UN Secretary General Ban Ki-Moon also called for quick and

meaningful change. "Leaders pledged to undertake effective and comprehensive reform of the international monetary and financial systems," the 40member Asia Europe Meeting (ASEM) said in a statement released late Friday.

"They agreed to take quickly appropriate initiatives in this respect, in consultation with all stakeholders and the relevant international financial institu-

China's Premier Wen Jiabao on Saturday called for more regulation of the world's financial system.

"We need to draw lessons from this crisis," Wen told journalists after the summit wrapped up.

1,500 militants, 73 troops killed in battle for Bajaur tribal region in last 2 months

Pakistani troops have recaptured a key town from al-Qaeda and Taliban militants after a twomonth operation in which 1,500 rebels and 73 soldiers were killed, the military said yesterday.

Security forces backed by helicopter gunships drove insurgents out of Loisam, a strategic town in the Bajaur tribal region bordering Afghanistan, which is at a cross-

Islamabad has previously hailed its operation in Bajaur as proof that it is responding to US and Afghan demands to take action against extremists in Pakistan's seven semi-autonomous tribal areas.

The extremists are accused of launching attacks on US and other foreign troops operating across the border in Afghanistan.


