Cameroon international Eto'o opened the scoring after just four minutes and Frenchman Thierry Henry netted on 13 minutes after brilliant play from Lionel Messi.

The floodgates opened on 20 minutes when Eto'o scored his second and his quick-fire hattrick was completed four minutes later. Eto'o becomes the league's top-

"We have given four weeks for state interventions to cease," Valcke said.

#### Platini attacks England

England won't win the World Cup again while leading Premier League clubs are so reliant on foreign players, according to Michel Platini, the president of European football governing body UEFA.

"Soon in England you will have no English players, no English managers, just foreign speculators," France football great Platini said in an interview with the Observer Sports Monthly here Sunday.

Platini, who captained his country to victory in the 1984 European Championships, added: "You have to ask yourself what that means for football at a national level.

"England is the traditional home of football but do you think that England will ever win the World Cup again? When you look at

the statistics right now - when hardly any English players are in the final stages of the Champions League - it is a good question and the answer is probably no. "At least it will not happen

under the present structures." England have won the World

Cup just once in their history, when they triumphed on home soil to beat the then West Germany 4-2 in the 1966 final at Wembley Stadium. Platini has repeatedly angered

many within the English game by his criticisms of the debt levels which finance the top clubs and he recently attacked his compatriot Arsene Wenger, the manager of Arsenal, for poaching youngsters for the Gunners' academy.

# Spurs sack Ramos

Harry Redknapp has been officially confirmed as the new manager of Premier League strugglers Tottenham Hotspur following the sacking of Juande Ramos last night.

Spurs, who sit bottom of the English top flight, have agreed a compensation package of around five million pounds (7.9 million dollars) with Portsmouth to bring in Redknapp immediately.

Ramos left the club after its worst-ever start to the season which has left it anchored to the bottom of the league, Spurs

announced late Saturday. Redknapp -- who was in charge at Portsmouth -- was confirmed as the new man in charge at White Hart Lane after Portsmouth had

"reluctantly" agreed to talks.

It has led to a return to London for the former West Ham boss, and although facing a huge challenge Redknapp believes his move will be best for the long-term future of both clubs.

He told BBC Radio Five Live Sportsweek programme: "I suddenly got a phone call and was told Tottenham were interested in me, and I thought it was a wind-up at

"Then when I had spoken to them, I decided it was a good move for everybody, for Portsmouth as well in the long term and they have a terrific compensation deal when


