A High Court (HC) bench yesterday refused to hear petitions filed by six ministers of past BNP-Jamaat alliance government for quashing proceedings against them in the Barapukuria coal mine corruption

Jamaat Ameer and former industries minister Motiur Rahman Nizami, Jamaat Secretary General and ex-social welfare minister Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojahid, former finance minister M Saifur Rahman, ex-health minister Khondker Mosharraf Hossain, former commerce minister Altaf Hossain Chowdhury and former state minister AKM Mosharraf Hossain had filed the petitions.

Cyclone Reshmi dies down with little loss

6 killed; crops, thatched houses razed

STAR REPORT

At least six people were killed and dozens of fishermen missing as Cyclone Reshmi lashed Khulna-Barisal coast yesterday morning with winds gusting up to 84 km an towards northeast.

Hundreds of thatched houses and crops on a vast tract of land were razed to the ground by gales and heavy rains.

Offshore islands and coastal areas were swept by tides leaping up to 6 feet above normal level.

10:00pm, communications between the capital and southern districts through interior waterways remained suspended. Road links between many areas however

A special bulletin from the Met office said Reshmi crossed the south coast near Patharghata at 9:00am. It soon weakened into a land depression and moved inland

Travelling across Faridpur, Madaripur, Chandpur, Dhaka and adjoining districts, the storm uprooted numerous trees, and electricity and telephone poles.

It grew even weaker as the day wore on, and exited through Netrakona border in the evening, As of filing the report at meteorologist Sadekul Alam told The Daily Star.

Govt finally acts on HC ban order

Different organisations and individuals, who demand prosecution of anti-liberation war criminals, yesterday raised formal objections to Jamaat's possible registration as a parliamentary political party with the Election Commission (EC).

The objections came after the EC had published a public notice on Sunday inviting objections to Jamaat's possible registration accompanied with supporting documents.

If the EC finds the objections to be credible, it will call both sides to

the commission secretariat for a hearing, said commission sources. "We will examine the state-

ments and the documents of both sides before taking a decision," Election Commissioner Brig Gen (retd) M Sakhawat Hussain told The Daily Star. Till yesterday, the EC had pub-

lished such public notices about 13 parties, but Jamaat is the only party against whom objections were filed so far, the sources said. War Crimes Facts Finding

Committee (WCFFC), Sector Commanders Forum, Ekattorer Ghatak Dalal Nirmul Committee,

Sammilito Sangskritik Jote, and Bangabandhu Sangskritik Jote are the organisations that raised the objections against Jamaat.

Forty six professionals in a joint

statement also raised a number of complaints against Jamaat, and urged the EC not to register the The objectors said Jamaat is still 'an illegal and unconstitutional party', which was involved in

human rights violations including genocide during the country's liberation war in 1971, and it has yet to confess to the crimes.


