The consultation, jointly organised by Research and Development Collective (RDC) and Voluntary Service Overseas (VSO), was presided over by Justice Gholam Rabbani.

Speakers at the consultation underscored the need for forming a national commission for the indigenous people of the country to overcome their problems.

The called on the political parties to include the issue of the indigenous people in their election manifestos and allocate reserved seats for them in the parliament and all the local bodies of representatives to ensure their participation

in their own development.

They said the non implementation of the CHT Treaty is a problem of the indigenous people and the government should take steps to implement it.

RDC General Secretary Prof Mesbah Kamal presented a keynote paper at the consultation.

He said representation of the indigenous people at the national, regional and local levels should be ensured, adding that nonrecognition of the indigenous people in the constitution and land-related problems are their main problems.

Gholam Rabbani said it is illegal to discriminate the indigenous people on grounds of race, sex or religions in this independent country. They also participated in the country's liberation war.

BCL expels 4 over factional clash at DU

Dhaka University BCL leaders expelled its four activists of Salimullah Muslim Hall unit as they were involved in Sunday's clash at the hall compound, which left five activists injured.

The expelled activists are Sumon, a fourth year student of public administration, Bahsar, a first year student of political science, Anu, a student of Pali and Sangskrit, and Russell, a first year student of philosophy.

Meanwhile, two activists of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL), student wing of Awami League, were injured in a fresh factional clash on Dhaka University (DU) campus yesterday.

During the clash, a group of activists loyal to DU BCL general secretary Sazzad Saqib Badsha beat up two students who are loyal to DU unit president Shohel Rana Tipu at Ziaur Rahman Hall.

Later, the two -- Shahidul Islam, a third year student of history, and Mahmud Hasan, a third year student of Bangla, -- were rushed to Dhaka Medical College Hospital with injures in their heads, chests

Sources said yesterday's clash was the sequel to August 13 clash when BCL men loyal to DU unit president Tipu beat up three activists loyal to Badsha at Ziaur Rahman Hall.

When asked for comments, DU unit General Secretary Badsha said these are isolated incidents resulting from personal conflicts and that they are trying to address these

Save waterlogged people in Kobadak river basin

Nagorik Sanghati urges chief adviser

People, living in the waterlogged areas along the bank of Kobadak river in Khulna-Jessore region, are suffering from severe shortage of food, drinking water and medicine, said the speakers at a press conference yesterday.

They urged the Chief Adviser Fakhruddin Ahmed to visit the area to see for himself the sufferings of the people and declare the region a disaster area.

The press conference was organised by Nagorik Sanghati at Dhaka Reporters' Unity auditorium in the city following a visit to waterlogged areas by its members.

The speakers placed a 10-point demand including immediate supply of adequate relief materials, setting up of special medical team

and creation of alternative jobs for the affected people.

The other demands included reexcavation of Kobadak river and other tributaries, removal of unplanned sluice gates and embankments, and withdrawal of all certificate cases and allocation

of fresh agricultural loans. Robayet Ferdous, associate professor of mass communication and journalism department at Dhaka University, urged the political parties to uphold the matter to create pressure on the government to resolve the problem immedi-

He also demanded formation of a committee to monitor the dredging works in the river Kobadak so that nobody gets chance to loot the allocated money.

Bodies of 17 Bangladeshis to be brought from Turkey soon

Bodies of 17 Bangladeshis, who were killed in a road accident at Istanbul in Turkey on October 5, will be brought home soon, official sources here said yesterday.

Expatriates' Welfare and Overseas Employment Ministry has taken initiative to bring the bodies to the country as per the instruction of Foreign Adviser Iftekhar Ahmed Chowdhury, also

in-charge of the ministry. The bodies will be brought back with the financial assistance of Wage Earners' Welfare Fund of the Bureau of Manpower, Employment and Training (BMET), the sources said.

The deceased were identified as M Motahar Miah, M Ahmed Ali, M Monjur Ali, M Ojud Miah, M Syed Miah and M Wahed Miah, M Faruk Ahmed, M Kamrul, M Shamsu of Habiganj district, M Alamgir, M Lil Miah, M Kadir and M Nasir of Sunamganj district, M Sattar Miah of Ihenidah, M Ripon of Faridpur, M Moksudul Islam of Chapainawabganj and Sujit Kumar of Netrakona district.

Nasir's family demands arrest of killers

The family of Nasirullah Khan yesterday demanded immediate arrest of his killers to protect them. "The killers of my father have been

repeatedly asking us over phone to withdraw the case filed against them, with threat of annihilating all of us," Nur-a-Alam, son of Nasir Ullah told reporters at a press conference at Dhaka Reporters' Unity.

Nasirullah, a veteran freedom fighter and employed as Ansar-VDP, was shot dead in his house at Uttarkhan in the city early hours on September 27 by unidentified crimi-

The scared son of Nasir said the killers admitting their involvement in the murder demanded Tk 5 lakh through a SMS on October 20 with threat of killing the entire family. The message also asked for withdrawal of the case.

The passion of 25-year old son of Nasir rose as he was speaking. "Please help us. Do something to save the family," he said with folded hands and broke down in tears.
