

# Rivals thwart central BNP team's meet in Barisal city

The central BNP team now on an organisational tour of the country, could not hold its scheduled meeting at Barisal party office due to resistance by a faction loyal to former Mayor Mojibur Rahman Sarwar.

The meeting was scheduled at 4 pm but not held at the district BNP office till 8 pm as Sarwar loyalists took position there to resist it, party sources said.

About 200 BNP activists carrying black flags and banners with slogans 'We don't accept pro-reformist leaders like Alal, Joyal, Selima' gathered in front of the district BNP office after holding a rally in front of Aswani Kumar Hall and took control of the premises yesterday noon.

Barisal district BNP vice president Maniruzaman Faruk, organizing secretary Advocate Shakhawat Hossain Jummon, city BNP secretary BNP Azizul Huq Akkas and city Jubo Dal convener Abul Kalam Shahin were seen among the demonstrators.

When this report was filed at about 8 pm, the party office premises was cordoned by police and agitated party activist seen waiting there to resist the central BNP team.

Tension mounted in the party rank and file as the rival factions loyal to Sarwar and Jobo Dal convener Moazzem Hossain Alal were in a stand-off position over visit by the team led by Selima Rahman. The pro-Sarwar group in Barisal city earlier announced that it will resist the visit.

Advocate Nazrul Islam Rajon, secretary of Barisal sadar south district BNP, said the meeting was

scheduled to be held at Barisal district and city BNP office at Aswanikumar Hall at 4 pm.

But the venue was later changed for the Gourmadi meeting.

Begum Selima Rahman, leader of the visiting team, acknowledging the agitation told The Daily Star that some party activists 'misunderstood' the visit. They thought that the team would make selection for nomination.

The visit by the central team is only to assess the field level situation and try to remove factional differences, she added.

The central team held another meeting at Gourmadi. It started at

about noon and continued till late evening. Party sources said the Gourmadi meeting was longed as the leaders could not allowed to hold the scheduled meeting in Barisal city.

The extended meeting of Barisal north district BNP at Gourmadi Public Library Hall was however held under police protection.

Majibor Rahman Dulal, acting president of Barisal Sadar north district BNP, presided over the meeting, attended by Begum Selima Rahman, central Jubo Dal secretary and former lawmaker Syed Moazzem Hossain Alal, central BNP law affairs secretary and former

lawmakers Abul Hossain and Bilkis Jahan Shirin as special guests.

Former lawmaker Mosharrif Hossain Mungu, who is central BNP organizing secretary and president of Barisal north district BNP, told journalists that the meeting called in Barisal city was illegal as the so called president in-charge can not call a meeting while there is party president. This violates the party constitution, he added.

The central team also includes Syed Moazzem Hossain Alal, advocate Joydul Abedin, Abul Hossain and Bilkis Jahan Shirin.

## FACTIONAL CLASHES SUST issues show cause on 27 BCL men

The authorities of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology (SUST) yesterday issued show cause notice on 27 activists of two rival factions of Bangladesh Chhatra League on charge of attacking opponents during the last few days.

They have been asked to reply in a week, Proctor Golam Ali Haider Chowdhury said.

Against the backdrop of sporadic clashes between the rival factions during the last two weeks, the Sust authorities on Tuesday banned procession, rally, human chain, seizure, blockade etc on the campus till December 4.

The authorities said the ban was needed to help holding Sust examinations including admission tests on November 29 and 30 smoothly.

However, all the student organisations have protested the ban.

# AL gives Nov 4 deadline to remove its chief, 4 members Human chain on Nov 4, 'mass hunger strike' Nov 6

Khagrachhari district Awami League yesterday gave the government a November 4 deadline for removal of Khagrachhari Hill District Council (KHDC) chairman and its four members for their alleged involvement with BNP-Jamaat politics and their 'planned design' to influence the upcoming national election.

At a press conference held at the party office, AL leaders announced that it will form a human chain in the hill town on November 4 and hold a 'mass hunger strike' on November 6 to press the demand.

Awami League will launch a tougher agitation if the demand is not met by November 4. The 'partisan' KHDC members should be removed immediately to hold a free and fair polls, district AL secretary Mohammad Zahedul Alam said in a written statement read out at the press conference. Front ranking district AL leaders including its president Zainuddin Lal Tripura attended the press conference.

BNP leader Monindra Lal Tripura was appointed KHDC chairman on March 29, 2006. Earlier, immediately after assumption of power, the BNP-Jamaat government on February 11, 2002, appointed four BNP leaders as KHDC members. They were Animesh Chakma Rinku, Anupama Tripura, Mohammad

Harunur Rashid and Mong Prue Chowdhury.

As per of the four members expired, the caretaker government on July 12 last year appointed four persons as KHDC members. The incumbent four members appointed for the interim period are Sadar upazila BNP vice-president Animesh Dewan Nandith, district Jubo Dal organizing secretary Sanu Mong Marma, Mohalchhari upazila BNP vice-president Ruhity Karbari and district Jamaat leader Abu Bakar Siddik.

The AL leaders at the press conference also claimed that the incumbent KHDC chairman would contest in the coming national polls.

KHDC councilor (member) Animesh Dewan will contest from Sadar Upazila and Ruhity Karbari

from Mohalchhari upazila in the upazila election as BNP men, they claimed.

All the KHDC officials are prospective candidates and so they are using KHDC and all government resources with this end in view, the AL leaders alleged.

"How polls can be free and fair if the four key persons becomes contenders?", Zahedul posed the question.

They are already campaigning, utilising resources sent as relief by the government and foreign donors, he claimed.

Moreover, the five KHDC officials have appointed 82 party men as project chairmen in 82 cluster villages to distribute government relief, the district AL secretary said. They have already distributed relief food grains, several thousand lungis, sarees and other clothes among people to win over possible voters.

They demanded that relief and other assistance be distributed through the district and upazila administrations and NGOs in the hill district till removal of the five KHDC officials.

District AL vice-president Rono Bikrom Tripura, joint secretary Saheb Ali, Mohila AL joint secretary Nigar Sultana, poura AL president Tapon Kanti and sadar upazila AL president Chandra Shekhor Das, among others were present at the press conference.

## 5 depts closed at Barisal Medical College

Five out of 32 departments of Barisal Sher-e-Bangla Medical College (SBMC) were closed down and six other departments are on the verge of closure due to teachers' shortage.

The closed departments are physical medicine, dentistry, otology endocrine, psychiatry and metabolic departments. Classes were suspended in these departments for a long time.

The departments which are facing closure are departments of forensic medicine, radiology, neurology, neuro surgery, blood transfusion and plastic surgery.

When contacted, SBMC principal Dr Zahid Hossain said the college authorities already informed the higher authorities about the problem but to no effect.

## BSF returns cattle trader's body

Indian Border Security Force (BSF) yesterday returned the body of a Bangladeshi cattle trader, gunned down by BSF on October 23 at Jajalpur, a bordering village in Basirhat thana under 24 Parganas district of West Bengal opposite to Bhatshala village in Debhata upazila.

After the cattle trader, Zakir Hossain, 30, son of Jonab Ali village Sekendra in Debhata upazila, was killed by BSF BDR sent a protest letter and asked the BSF authorities to return the body.

Receiving the body from BSF in the evening, BDR of Bhatshala camp handed it to the victim's relatives, BDR said.

The human chain was formed as part of the forum's three-day programme announced earlier.

Later, they brought out a protest procession and held a protest rally in front of the central library.

Speakers urged the university teachers, general students and progressive people to launch a

tougher agitation against the anti-liberation forces. They also demanded of government trial of war criminals through speedy trial tribunal. They urged the government to announce the airport roundabout area as 'Lalon Chhatra'. Demanding exemplary punishment of bigots, they urged the government to ensure the atmosphere to flourish the Bengali culture and heritage.

Finally, they vowed to continue their agitation until re-installation of the sculptures at its original place.

Among others, Prof SM Abu Bakkar, Prof Moloy Kumar Bhowmik, Susmita Chakrabarti, Faruk Hossain and cultural activists addressed.
