## Huge RMG materials gutted in Gazipur

A huge amount of readymade garments and raw materials were gutted by a devastating fire at a garment factory at Shreepur in Gazipur yesterday.

Factory workers alleged that authorities of Akij Design Ltd plotted the drama of fire as a technique for closing the factory all on a sudden and deprive them of their dues.

The cause of the fire, however, could not be confirmed.

Factory workers said the authorities closed the factory on October 30 after paying their monthly salary and as they have come to join the factory, they found its main entrance under lock and key.

The workers became angered at the sudden closure of the factory and demanded payment of their dues in accordance with labour law. As they were waiting outside, some staffs from the owner's side Rasel, Khorshed, Faruk, Bashar, and Badal inside the factory called

them inside the factory, sources said.

The workers said owners' men left the factory through its backdoor by setting fire to the locked factory at 9:00am.

Workers also claimed that factory staffs responsible to put the fire out were seen sitting lazily during the fire, adding that this is a technique of the factory owners to show the government that they have incurred a loss and compelled to shut down the factory.

Gazipur circle Assistant Police Super Jamil Hasan said the factory authorities did not inform police of the incident and they came to know about the fire after they reach the factory following the demonstration by workers.

Claiming that the factory incurred a loss of Tk 10 crore in the fire, managing director of the factory named Abu Musa said the factory was closed after paying dues to the workers, as there were no sufficient buying orders to run the factory.
