As majority shareholder of ACI Formulations Limited (ACIFL), the Board of Directors of Advanced Chemical Industries Limited has approved the following projects for ACI Formulations Ltd (ACIFL). These projects are in line with ACIFL's growth plan and will allow them to pursue aggressively in the agri-business sector.

a. Sulphur Project-

Sulphur is an important micronutrient for most of the crops. The use of sulphur shows significant increase over last few years (annually 20%) with total consumption around 8500 metric ton per year. The current demand is fulfilled entirely through import and therefore ACI Formulation's sulphur manufacturing plant will be the first one in Bangladesh. By establishing its own manufacturing plant, ACIFL will be able to dominate in this emerging sector and the farmers' community will have better choice in the form of easy availability and competitive price. The total project cost has been estimated at Taka 135 million with pay back period slightly more than 3 years. The annual average turnover will be Taka 292 million with estimated average PAT of Tk. 54 million.

b. NPKS Fertilizer

NPKS is compound of fertilizers like TSP, Urea, DAP, MoP and Gypsum which are mixed in a certain ratio. Due to lower cost and easier application process the use of NPKS is increasing. The current estimated demand of NPKS is around 400,000 metric ton with a growth of 20% per year. ACI has already entered into fertilizer business and therefore it makes sense for it to have its own manufacturing facility to play an active role in the market. The current leading position in crop care products with strong distribution network throughout the country will also help ACIFL to capture a sizable share of NPKS market. The proposed plant will have a capacity of 100000 MT per year with estimated market share of around 25%. The total cost of the project is Taka 276 million with pay back period of 3.4 years. The annual average turnover is estimated at Tk. 1.6 billion with PAT of Tk. 51 million.

c. Offloading of 10% Share of ACI Motors in Favour of ACI Formulations Limited

ACIFL is already operating almost in all sub-sectors of agri-sectors. However, still now ACIFL has no presence in agriculture machinery area. This is a growing business area and to give the farmers' communities total solutions of their need it was felt that ACIFL should also be in agriculture machinery trade. This will be resolved by allowing ACIFL to become a shareholder of ACI Motors. By becoming a shareholder of ACI Motors, ACIFL will be able to communicate the availability of agriculture machinery and equipment and be able to act as "one stop solution" providers for the farmers communities.
