The 32nd anniversary of the 'Jail Killing Day' was observed in the country yesterday commemorating the assassination of four national leaders inside the Dhaka Central Jail.

The four liberation war heroes --Syed Nazrul Islam, acting president of 1971 Bangladesh government in exile, Tajuddin Ahmed, prime minister of the same government, M Mansur Ali, finance minister, and AHM Qamruzzaman, minister for home affairs, relief and rehabili tation -- were shot dead inside jail on this day in 1975.

The Power Cell is expected to complete a "second round" of evaluation of the 50 megawatt Chittagong rental power project within this week after the power ministry rejected a hurriedly done bid evaluation last month, sources say.

Upon inviting bids from various power companies on October 16, the Cell completed the evaluation within only three days. It recommended a joint venture of Royce Power Engineering Ltd of Hong Kong and local Asian Entech Power Corporation and Shasha Denims Ltd that proposed to set up the Mohila League, Jatiya Sramik plant using cheap but environmentally hostile Heavy Fuel Oil

A top power ministry official says, "Bidders can submit different documents making big claims. They may appear to be convincing. But it's our job to cross-check these documents to see if these are genuine. Our experience says bidders often submit fake or misleading documents just to win the bid."

"We hope the Power Cell does not resort to the same type of sketchy evaluation of last month," another official said, adding based on the negative experience of the eight small rental power projects, the Chittagong tender terms and conditions were refined to find the

Sources say some documents submitted by Royce-Asian Entech did not comply with the bid terms and conditions.

The tender documents say the bidder must have experience in providing rental or Independent Power Project (IPP) serving in the last three years and will furnish end-user certificate or contract documents with power off-taker in support of the experience.

Royce Power Engineering has furnished a certificate that looks like a computer printout having no official letter-head. The certificate was issued under the name of a company "Jianmen Power Plant, Jiangmen City, Guandong, China," stating that Royce power has an

For years people are having the famous and delicious confections like Porabari's chamcham, Comilla's rosomalai, monda from Muktagachha, curd from Bogra and rashogolla from Jessore. These goodies are available in the capital and many other places elsewhere and consumers buy the items thanks to their reputation as well as well-financed adverts.

Besides these, strawberry, chocolate, vanilla ice-cream, milk shake, lassi, cheese, butter and chocolate -- all the items are mouthwatering dairy products popular among the consumers.

But not too many people are aware that many of these items might pose a serious risk to their health. Talking to the people SEE PAGE 15 COL 3 related to business, it was learned

that most of the products are made with sub-standard milk powder that possibly contains poisonous melamine.

Even in some cases, it was found that many of these items are made with adulterated milk.

Now many of the city dwellers are worried about the dairy products after the news of industrial chemical melamine mixed with powdered milk was published.

"For the last few days my daughter is mad at me as I don't buy her ice-cream. My son is also fond of sweetmeats. But I don't dare buy them," said Giasuddin Ahmed from Kalabagan.

Zardari warns US over missile strikes

AFP, Islamabad

President Asif Ali Zardari warned the new US commander for Iraq and Afghanistan on Monday that missile strikes on Pakistani territory were "counterproductive" and detrimental to the 'war on terror.'

The most high-profile protest yet from Islamabad came as General David Petraeus made his first visit here since he took over the position last week, amid claims that it could signal a shift in strategy in Afghanistan.

"Continuing drone attacks on our territory, which result in loss of precious lives and property, are counterproductive and difficult to explain by a democraticallyelected government," Zardari said. "It is creating a credibility gap,"

the state-run Associated Press of

Pakistan quoted him as saying.

The series of strikes by unmanned drones against suspected al-Qaeda and Taliban militants hiding in Pakistan's tribal badlands bordering Afghanistan have raised tensions between the two countries.

Defence Minister Chaudhry Ahmad Mukhtar earlier told Petraeus that Pakistan's sovereignty and territorial integrity should be respected, warning that future incidents could affect the battle for hearts and minds.

"The frequent drone attacks could lead to generate anti-America sentiments as well as create outrage and uproar among the people," Mukhtar's department said in a statement. Former, Pakistani general and defence analyst Talat Masood said
