The last three matches including the Twenty20 International was played under cloudy and chilly conditions and it seemed that they are going to face the same fate in the third and final game as there was no sunshine yesterday and there is rain forecast for today.

"It would be fantastic if we can play the match under sunshine and

in better weather because we played all the matches in bad conditions," said Bangladesh captain Mohammad Ashraful.

Jacques Kallis, who attended the pre-match press conference after practicing at the ground yesterday, also said that they were looking forward for some good weather for the final one-dayer against the Tigers to ensure the clean sweep.

"There are nice practice facilities here and the ground is also nice. Now hope that the weather doesn't play with the match," said the prolific all rounder.

Besides the weather there were however another new factor for the Bangladesh skipper to be worried about which is the proper handling of the bowlers during the batsmencontrolled Powerplay as South

Africa made maximum use of it in the first two games.

"Our bowlers did an excellent job in the last few series but they struggled in the (batting) Powerplay and we have to find a way to stop the runs.

"For us there is hardly any scope to think about the series outcome rather every match is important to show our improvement. We didn't play well in the second match and now we want to get back the confidence before the Test series," said Ashraful.

Kallis however expressed his disappointment like his captain (Graeme Smith) over the approach

The Mashrafe mystery

Much is being made of the apparent 'disinterest' of Tigers pace 'spearhead Mashrafe Bin Mortaza in representing his country by constantly citing injuries. But for the man from Narail, the signals he is receiving from his body are indeed cause for concern.

The leading paceman missed the tour-opening Twenty20 match due to back pain and is all set to miss today's third and final one-

dayer with the same complaint. But while the aching back has caused Mashrafe physical discomfort, the bigger cause for apprehension now seems to be the fact that some segments of the squad think he is feigning injury to opt out of the inconsequential final ODI.

"Yes, I am always concerned about my injury and I always fear about this injury because you have to understand that I have had four operations. That's why I always

complain to the physio at the slightest discomfort. You must understand that I do it for my safety."

The physio in question, Darryl Lifson, was mutedly ambiguous when asked to assess the fast bowlers' condition.

Lifson whose contract will end after this series only replied with the rhetorical: "Mashrafe is a good been, is no easy task.

While that could mean many things in and of itself, the Narail Express is in no doubt as to where the suspicions lie.

"I know, many laughed at me when I complained about the injury....butIdon'tknowwhatisthe meaning of this. The pain is mine and I know how difficult it is for me. I have been playing for eight years now and except for a few initial matches I have never played any match without some sort of discomfort," said Mashrafe, who has had both his knees operated on.

"Many say it's a psychological problem but it's hard for anybody to understand if he is not going through such a painful situation in

his career. I can bet that in my situation nobody will be able to sustain themselves at the interna-

tional level," he added. That is understandable, since Mashrafe is the strike-bowler in the side and has often had to shoulder the brunt of the bowling, which being as injury-prone as he has

Fast bowlers are a rare breed and need constant looking after something that seems to have gone missing at the Tigers camp as a visibly upset Mashrafe seemed well aware of where the allegations against him seemed to be coming

"I feel terrible when people are whispering about my injury and even though I know who they are....I don't want to mention names.'

Curiously though and to his benefit, Mashrafe has missed just two games in the past calendar year. It is a fact that he has in mind.

"Last one and half year I dropped out of just one one-day

BCB polls today

With the Caretaker Government in power, everyone would hope for today's Bangladesh Cricket Board (BCB) elections to be fair and free of any influence like it happened in football about seven months ago.

As all previous elections (1998, 2001, 2005) of the country's richest sport federation were tainted by political influence, everyone also expects that no interference by the government would allow the best possible candidates to win.

are at stake for the 25-member committee (the president and a National Sports Council representative to be nominated), two directors have already been elected unopposed from the divisions. They are Asaduzzaman Khasru of Barisal and Imran Chowdhury of Sylhet, who were lone candidates form their respective divisions.

According to the new BCB constitution, ten directors will be elected in Category 1 (districts and divisions) by 68 voters, 12 in Category 2 from Dhaka-based clubs by 52 voters and one in Category 3 (cricketers, education boards,

women's wings, etc.) by 47 voters. For the remaining eight posts in Category 1, 15 candidates are still in the race with Dewan Shafiul Arefin Tutul, Abdullah Al Fuad Redwan Although 23 directorial posts and Sailab Hossain Tutul competing in Dhaka, Sirajuddin Mohammed Chowdhury, Manjurul Karim and identical result like the Bangladesh Nazmul Ahsan in Chittagong, Syed

Zahid Hossain, Kazi Shamim Ahsan, Shahidul Islam and Yakub Kabir in Khulna and Mahbub Jamal, Imtiaz Ahmed, Jainal Abedin and

Shahiduzzaman Shahid in Rajshahi. After the chances of building a panel of consensus failed, the two groups -- Mahbubul Anam and Aminul Haque Moni-led 'cricket development panel' and 'united sports panel' led by Enayet Hossain Siraj and Ahmed Sajjadul Alam Bobby -- for the Dhaka-based clubs will be pitted against each other

with full force. The two panels now have 12 candidates each for same number of directors and the prediction is that both will have equal share of directors in the end with only the Alamgir, Shahin Aftabur Reza' tested ones winning -- another
