#### 4-party won't take part in 'stage-managed' polls: Delwar

BNP Secretary General Khandaker Delwar Hossain yesterday said the four-party alliance would not participate in any stage-managed election designed to form a 'rubber stamp parliament and a puppet government.'

"We want to take part in a free, fair and credible election and will accept the election result," he said at a meeting in the city's Diploma Engineers' Institute to press home the four-party's demand to release their three top leaders.

"Those who will win in that election will form the government and we will sit on the opposition bench if we lose," Delwar said, adding that they however will not accept any staged election.

Deployment will be made for 20 days to ensure poll security

The armed forces will be in the field along with other law enforcement agencies for 20 days from December 12 to maintain law and order before and after the upcoming parliamentary and upazila

parishad elections. A high-powered meeting of the Election Commission (EC), the government, armed forces and different law enforcement and intelligence agencies yesterday took

the decision on troops deployment.

Chaired by Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) ATM Shamsul Huda, the meeting decided to engage the army, navy, air force, Bangladesh Rifles (BDR), armed police, Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) and Ansar in election duties six days before the parliamentary election scheduled for December 18.

## BNP desperate for polls after 2 months

AL may settle for 10 days' deferral; move on to strike a deal

As the BNP is pressing hard to delay the general elections, the government talked with other political parties over the issue, and the AL, a key player to influence any such decision, has indicated that it may accept a deferral by only about 10

The BNP-led four-party alliance wants to put back the election date by two-to-three months so that it can prepare itself for a better-thannow-perceived result, sources said.

On the other hand, Awami

League (AL), which feels itself in a better position to come to power, hinted it can afford a deferral by not more than 10 days, party sources told The Daily Star. It is agreeable to such a situation in the hope of having a fully participatory elec-

The positions of the two major axes of the election fulcrum now puts the government in a sticky situation as it has yet to find an acceptable middle ground to bring both parties and their alliances to election.

The High Court (HC) yesterday granted two months' ad interim bail to former finance minister M Saifur Rahman, Jamaat-e-Islami Ameer Matiur Rahman Nizami and Secretary General Ali Ahsan Mohammad Mojahid in the Barapukuria coalmine corruption

An HC bench of justices Muzammel Hossain and Afzal Hossain Ahmed stayed proceedings of the case against them for two months and issued a rule upon

the government and the Anticorruption Commission (ACC) to explain within four weeks why the proceedings against them should

not be quashed.

Meanwhile, the Special Judge's Court-2 fixed November 23 as the next date for hearing in the case after the three politicians along with another accused former state minister for energy AKM Mosharraf Hossain appealed to it to re-fix the date saying they would submit their nomination papers to contest the next parliamentary election. #### EC forms 80 electoral probe committees

The Election Commission (EC) vesterday constituted 80 electoral enquiry committees comprising judicial officers to prevent and control polls-related irregularities prior to the December 18 parliamentary election.

As the number of parliamentary seats for Dhaka metropolitan area has now risen to 15 from seven in the past, eight enquiry committees will work in the area, and one in each in the 64 districts to stop preelection irregularities by political parties and candidates, sources in the EC said.

Four enquiry committees will work in Chittagong metropolitan area and one each in Rajshahi, Khulna, Barisal and Sylhet metropolitan areas.


