SC upholds HC order; Rawshan, 16 others have to pay fine or face imprisonment

The Supreme Court (SC) yesterday upheld the High Court (HC) verdict that had fined Tk 10,000 or two year's in jail to each of the 17 accused, including Jatiya Party Senior Presidium Member Rawshan Ershad, in the Janata Tower corruption case.

The four-member full bench of the Appellate Division headed by Chief Justice MM Ruhul Amin also upheld another HC order that had directed the government to confiscate the properties of Janata Tower. However, the apex court

granted an appeal filed by the government against the High Court order, which earlier directed the government to hand over Janata Tower to a group led by Shukur Ali Pradhan.

The SC delivered the verdicts after dismissing separate appeals filed by the government and the accused.
