



The first artiste to perform was Mahiuzzaman Chowdhury. The artiste performed four Rabindra Sangeet --"Tumi shondharo meghomala," "Badolo din-er prothom kadom mance with "Ei Bangla-key phool," "Shudu tomar baani" and Amar hridoy tomar apon hater doleye."
