Govt goes for frantic negotiation on polls

BNP refuses to budge on 4 demands; advisers rush to AL for talks

A talk between a delegation of government advisers and BNP leadership ended inconclusively last night as the two sides failed to reach a consensus over rescheduling the parliamentary election and about a timeframe for lifting the state of emergency.

BNP insiders said the government side pation. proposed deferment of the December 18 parliamentary election by 10 days and lifting of the emergency after all nominations are submitted, but BNP did not concede and neither 'completely snuffed the idea'

hold the election within December but BNP wanted to postpone it at least until mid-January next year.

The government advisers argued, if the parliamentary election is deferred into the next year the political climate might veer into a new direction which

might not be desired by any side.

The military backed caretaker government jumpstarted the fresh parley with major political parties in a bid to hold the stalled ninth parliamentary election with participation of all parties, following a 48hour ultimatum from BNP-led four-party alliance the night before for meeting its four-point demand to facilitate its partici- the government delegation met with a

BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia on Monday night put forward the demands saying that her party and its allies will take the politicos in her Sudha Sadan resipart in the election if the government meets all their demands within the next 48 hours, prompting the government to The government side was adamant to arrange the parleys with both major politico-electoral alliances.

The four-party demands are total lifting of the state of emergency, suspension of some 'objectionable' clauses in the amended Representation of the People Order (RPO) including repeal of clause 91(e), deferment of the December

28 upazila elections till one month from the parliamentary poll, and rescheduling of the polls ensuring that the hajis will get to cast their votes.

Before last night's talk with BNP, the advisers met Chief Adviser Fakhruddin Ahmed in his office in the afternoon.

The announcement came after a meeting between top leaders of the parties at AL President Sheikh Hasina's Sudha Sadan resi-

During the one-and-half-hour talks that began at 2:30pm, the JP delegation led by its Chairman HM Ershad handed a list of 50 candidates to Hasina for nomination from the alliance, said meeting sources.

As of filing this report at 9:00pm, JP acting chairman Anisul Islam Mahmud and presidium member Ziauddin Ahmed Bablu were discussing the seat-sharing issue with Hasina.



Polls to be free of arms, criminals

Assure Rab, poilce

Chiefs of police and Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) yesterday made public announcements promising to make sure that the upcoming elections are unfettered by hooliganism and use of illegal firearms. Inspector General of Police (IGP) Nur Mohammad said the

existing law and order situation does not require special drives against criminals and illegal arms as criminal activities and the use of illegal arms 'are currently not that prevalent'. He however added, special drives will be carried out if neces-

sary, but those will be launched unannounced. Rab Director General Hasan Mahmood Khandakar said his

force will take special security measures ahead of the polls, so criminals may not disrupt the electoral environment.

EU to send 150 poll observers

The European Commission (EC) has decided to deploy election observers for the December 18 general election, a European Union (EU) announcement in Dhaka yesterday said.

Alexander Graf Lambsdorff, member of the European

Parliament, will lead the 150-memebr EU Election Observation Mission (EOM), it said. The commission made the decision after the government repealed elements of the emergency power rules early this

In January last year, the EU had suspended its observation mission after serious political turmoil centring the stalled January 22 polls brought the country to a standstill.

Massive hunt for killers of 3 indigenous leaders

Security forces yesterday started a special drive at bordering Thanchi upazila in the district following killing of 'mouja headman' Pai Thoai U and two other tribal men by the armed criminals at two points within a short span of

time Monday night. In the drive, two indigenous people were arrested on suspicion of their involvement with the killings. An army helicopter hovered over the area to keep watch, an unconfirmed source said.

A source at the police station said, Singapa 'mouja headman' Pai Thoai U (45) was gunned down in a brush fire by the armed terrorists in Modok area at about 7:00 pm Monday. After a few minutes, the

BRANDS WITHOUT REGISTRATION

Warrant issued to arrest 2 Chinese milk distributors

The government yesterday filed two separate criminal cases against two local distributors of Chinese powdered milk Yashili-1, Yashili-2 and Sweet Baby-2 on charges of importing and marketing those without approval of the authorities concerned.

The accused are MA Rahim, proprietor of Mou Enterprise at Station Road, Chittagong, and Belal Ahmed Sharif, managing director of M/s Allway Trading Limited at Lalbagh in the capital. After hearing, Metropolitan Magistrate Abdul Majid recorded statements of the complainant, took the charges into cogni-

sance and issued arrest warrants against the distributors. Public Health Nutrition Institution Director Prof Fatema Parvin Chowdhury filed the cases with the Chief Metropolitan Magistrate's Court, Dhaka.

In her complaint, Fatema mentioned that the Mou Enterprise had been marketing Chinese powdered milk Sweet Baby-2 as local distributor, violating the rules and regulations of the Breast Milk Substitutes Ordinance, 1984. The company does not have any registration and shows no manufacturing and expiry dates on the containers, she said.

"Melamine was found in some powered milk recently." Following the development, a market monitor committee started conducting inquiry into matters in Dhaka and its adjacent areas," Fatema said in her complaint.

She went on that the committee, during its inquiry in
