

HC asks govt to allow Mayor Mohiuddin to go to S'Arabia

The High Court yesterday asked the government to allow Chittagong City Corporation (CCC) Mayor ABM Mohiuddin Chowdhury to go to Saudi Arabia for performing Hajj.

In response to a writ petition filed by Mohiuddin, the HC bench of Justice Syed Mahmud Hossain and Justice Quamrul Islam Siddiqui also ordered the mayor, who was arrested on corruption charges but released on bail recently, to return after the pilgrimage.

The court also stayed a government order refusing to permit Mohiuddin to go to Saudi Arabia.

It also issued a rule upon the government to explain why the order should not be declared illegal.

Advocate Hari Sadhan Deb Brahman, counsel for the petitioner, told reporters that Mohiuddin will go to Saudi Arabia on November 22 and return on December 14.

70pc repair of Meghna Bridge complete




