### Mourinho's EPL medal sold at auction

Former Chelsea manager Jose Mourinho's Premier League winners' medal sold for 21,600 pounds (25,000 euros) at an auction in England on Wednesday.

Mourinho threw the medal into the stands at Stamford Bridge after Chelsea beat Manchester United 3-0 to win the 2005-06 title.

It was caught by a fan and sold to an unnamed telephone office and earned the defeat. bidder at a sporting memora-Auctioneers in Chester.

At the same auction, a winner's medal from the 1930 World Cup was sold for 28,800 pounds (34,362 euros).

The gold medal was awarded to Uruguay captain Jose Nasazzi after his side defeated Argentina 4-2 to become the first World champions.

Arsenal manager Arsene Wenger confirmed that Theo Walcott will be sidelined for at least three months after the England winger had surgery on his dislocated shoulder on Thursday.

Walcott was injured when he slipped on the rain-soaked pitch in Berlin during a training session with Fabio Capello's squad on Tuesday.

Wenger admitted he could not blame the English Football Association for the accident so the club are unlikely to pursue compensation for the loss of a key asset.

"I'm disappointed because he is an important part of the squad, but that could have happened in training here," Wenger said. "It was an accident that could have happened anywhere.

"I do not blame the FA for that. It was accidental in training and I accept that.

'In a moment like that you do not think about compensation you think about how you can replace the player."

It is the fourth time Walcott has suffered a shoulder injury as he struggles with a hereditary condition inherited from his father Don.

Walcott had surgery on an identical injury on his left shoulder in 2006 and had only just returned from a shoulder problem suffered at Stoke earlier this season.

#### Ballack likely to stay on

Chelsea chief executive Peter Kenyon is confident Germany midfielder Michael Ballack will commit his long-term future to the Premier League leaders.

Ballack's current contract, worth around 120,000 pounds (142,000 euros) a week, expires in June and talks are yet to start over a new deal.

But Chelsea have an option to extend the former Bayern Munich midfielder's stay by an another 12 months and Ballack has admitted he would be happy to end his career at Stamford Bridge.

Kenyon believes a deal will be agreed and he told The Sun: "Michael has played a great part for Chelsea and there is no reason for us not to exercise that option."

### Honduras, Mexico advance

Honduras defeated Mexico 1 0 with the help of an own goal on a waterlogged field Wednesday to advance in 2010 South Africa World Cup qualifying at the expense of Jamaica.

Jamaica defeated Canada 3-0 but it wasn't enough to put them through to the next round of qualifying in the North, Central America and Caribbean Zone.

Mexico also advanced to the final round despite the loss to Honduras who were battling for one of the three spots up for grabs on Wednesday.

The United States, Costa Rica and El Salvador had already clinched their berths. "We showed our quality tonight," said Honduras'



### S Africa edge Cameroon

South Africa claimed a recordequalling fourth consecutive international victory Wednesday by edging Cameroon 3-2 in a Nelson Mandela Challenge thriller.

It was the fourth time the 2009 FIFA Confederations Cup and 2010 World Cup hosts have achieved the feat and brought a happy ending to a disappointing year for Bafana qualifiers. Bafana (The Boys).
