Most of the poor stay out of safety net

Most of the poor remain out of the purview of the government's safety net benefits, most of which go to the less povertyhit areas, says a World Bank report.

The report titled "Poverty Assessment poverty rates, the report clarifies. for Bangladesh: Creating Opportunities and Bridging the East-West Divide" released yesterday says the public resources allocation under the safety net programme is not consistent with poverty

In Sylhet Division 22 percent households are safety net beneficiaries, while

the national average is 13 percent, it adds. Coverage of safety net programmes also varies significantly by regions and does not correlate well with division-level

It cites the example of Rajshahi Division, which has the highest poverty rate of 51.2 percent but has got only 12.1 percent of safety nets coverage. In Dhaka the poverty rate is 32 percent and the division got 14.3 percent of safety net benefits, the report adds.

It says less than one-fourth of the bottom 10 percent of the poor receive the government's safety net benefits.

Asked if Pakistan would adopt the policy of no-first use of nuclear weapons, he said "Most definitely yes. We hope we will never get into that position. I am for a South Asian Non-Nuclear Treaty. I am glad I can say with full confidence that I can get my parliament to agree to it right away. Can you get your parliament

Zardari was speaking to Indian politicians and businessmen via video-conferencing at a "Leadership Summit" organised by a leading Indian newspaper at a five-star hotel in New Delhi
