gap on the goal-starved plete Arsenal's misery. English Premier League leaders Chelsea, Liverpool and Manchester United.

The imploding Gunners suffered their worst result of the season, as the top three were all held to goalless draws -- top club Chelsea at home to Newcastle, secondplaced Liverpool at home Fulham, and United away to Aston Villa.

Elsewhere, Portsmouth drew 2-2 with visitors Hull and Bolton grabbed a 3-1 win at Middlesbrough.

Arsenal are now in serious trouble with dressing-room strife matched by dismal results on the pitch.

William Gallas, stripped of the Gunners captaincy having blasted his teammates in midweek for their lack of passion, was not even in the squad for the trip to Eastlands.

And the damage worsened as Arsenal collapsed to their third defeat in four league games, leaving them 10 points off the pace in fifth place.

Chelsea's Deco has made no secret of his delight at Michael Ballack's return to fitness, as he believes his fellow midfielder will give the club a welcome boost.

Ballack has spent much of the season so far on the sidelines, and he underwent surgery in October to remove neuromas - benign tumburs from each of his feet.

The German star returned to action yesterday as a second-half substitute in Chelsea's 0-0 draw with Newcastle United, and he instantly reminded everyone of his importance to Luiz Felipe Scolari's side with his aggression and class.

The 32-year-old's recovery could see Deco rotated in and out of the first team over the next few weeks, but that does not seem to bother the ex-Barcelona playmaker.

"It is good for us to have him back because he is a great, great player," he told the press.

"We need more players because we are playing many games and have some injuries.

"It is difficult to play against him because he is a strong player, very competitive and experienced. I have played against him three or four times for Portugal." The Blues currently top the

Premier League table despite the absence of several key players, including Michael Essien, Ricardo Carvalho and Didier Drogba.


