## 2 criminals killed in crossfire with Rab

Two accomplices of slain listed criminal Rosen were killed in a gunfight with the members of Rapid Action Battalion (Rab) at Kadamtoli in the city early yesterday.

The dead were identified as Babu, 26, and Suman, 25, also known as 'killer

Rab-10 officials said a team of the elite force, acting on a tip-off, raided Kadamtoli water purification area at about 3:05am to arrest some accomplices of Rosen who gathered there to plot crimes.

"But sensing danger, the gangsters opened fire on Rab men, prompting them to fire back. During the gunfight that lasted for 25 minutes, Babu and Suman were killed in crossfire," a Rab press release said.

The elite force recovered two revolvers, one pistol and 203 rounds of bullets from the spot.

The bodies were sent to Dhaka Medical College Hospital morgue.

Rab and police said both of them were wanted in a number of criminal cases, including murder and extortion.

In a similar encounter on November 26, Rosen and one of his accomplices, Bidyut, were killed in crossfire at Shanir Akhra in the city.

'Establish college for physiotherapy students'

# 2 murdered in city

Two people, including a woman, were murdered in separate incidents in the city yesterday and six alleged criminals were arrested in this connection.

riding two motorcycles shot Asif Hossain Kanon in his head in front of the Chhapra Mosque at Nimtali in the old part of the city at 12:15am yesterday, leaving him dead on the spot. Kanon aged about 25 was an unemployed youth of Abul Hasnat Road under Kotwali Police Station. Local people caught four criminals redhanded while fleeing spraying bullets on Kanon.

Police arrested two other criminals according to the statement of the four arrestees.

Munni Begum, mother of the deceased, told police that a boy named Miraj called her son out of the house at around 8:30pm on Sunday. Police said an unidentified

boy demanded Tk 5 lakh over phone from Munni Begum and threatened to kill her son if the money was not paid.






