#### Scrutiny of nomination starts today

The returning officers (ROs) today start scrutinising nomination papers filed by candidates to decide who are qualified to contest the upcoming | REJAUL KARIM BYRON parliamentary polls as per the stringent criteria laid down in the electoral laws.

After the scrutiny, which will be completed tomorrow, any MP aspirant can appeal against the ROs' decision, acceptance or rejection of anyone's nomination, to the Election Commission (EC) in the next three days.

76 identified as loan defaulters on EC list

20 go to court for not to be declared defaulters

Bangladesh Bank has identified 76 loan defaulters on the Election Commission's (EC) list of candidates of different political parties for the upcoming parliamentary elections.

The central bank is cross checking records of another 31 candidates.

Some 20 candidates have, meanwhile, filed writ petitions with the High Court (HC) for stay orders on the process of declaring them loan defaulters.

Relevant departments of Bangladesh Bank and other banks have been directed to work for vacating the HC stay orders as early as possible.

Of the 76 loan defaulters, eight are candidates of the Awami League, 12 of BNP, four of Jatiya Party, two of Gono Forum, five of Bikalpadhara Bangladesh and three of Liberal Democratic Party. The rest are contesting the polls as candidates of Progressive Democratic Party and a few Islamist parties and as independent candidates.

The EC had sent the list of 2,139 parliamentary poll candidates to Bangladesh Bank on Monday. The central bank completed scrutiny of 80 percent of the list as of late last night.

Bangladesh Bank Executive Director

Khondker Mazharul Haque told reporters yesterday that nine teams of the credit information bureau of Bangladesh Bank are working on the matter from morning to night. They worked until 9:00pm on Monday.

# Khaleda, Hasina may face off EC mulls rivals' electoral debate

The Election Commission (EC) plans to organise electoral debates on crucial issues before the December 29 parliamentary elections with participation of top political leaders. This might bring archrivals Sheikh Hasina and Khaleda Zia face to face.

Election Commissioner Brig Gen (retd) M Sakhawat Hussain vesterday held a meeting with senior officials of Bangladesh Television (BTV), BBCWorld Service Trust and UK's Department for International Development (DFID) to proceed with the plan. The meeting discussed different technical aspects of organis-

ing the debates and Sakhawat asked the agency officials to prepare proposals on it for further discussion, sources said. Later, Election Commissioner Sakhawat told The Daily Star

that they only held a primary discussion at his office. "It is really a tough task. We will have to work a lot to organise the debate,"

## Thai govt dissolved

Court strips PM of his post for vote fraud, outlaws ruling party; airport to reopen

McCain visits A Thai court stripped Prime Minister Somchai Wongsawat of his post and outlawed the ruling party yesterday, prompting jubilant antigovernment protesters to lift a blockade of Bangkok's main airport.

Party leaders quickly vowed to form another government under a new banner but without Somchai, who was barred from politics five years by the Constitutional Court in a vote fraud case.

The move was welcomed by the People's A chartered plane carrying Alliance for Democracy (PAD), which occupied him from New Delhi landed at Suvarnabhumi airport a week ago to cap a Zia International Airport at months-long campaign to oust Somchai, the 10:25pm. He is accompanied brother-in-law of exiled former premier SEE PAGE 15 COL 5

Thaksin Shinawatra.

"My duty is over. I am now an ordinary citizen," Somchai, 61, told reporters in the northern city of Chiang Mai from where he has been governing since the blockade began.

Under a military constitution adopted after a 2006 coup against then-premier Thaksin, any political party in which a single executive is convicted of vote fraud must be dissolved and all executives banned.

Somchai, a former lawyer, spent less than three months in power, beset by the royalist protesters who accused his government of acting as a proxy for their nemesis Thaksin and of being hostile to the monarchy.
