Three people, killed on the spot, were Khwaja Haider, 38, joint secretary of Netrakona unit of Udichi, Rani Begum, 35, wife of a police sub-inspector, and a beggar Joinal, 55.

Six others succumbed to their injuries on way to or at hospital in Netrakona and Mymensingh.

They were Rais Uddin, 35, Achhab Uddin, 40, Jahanara Begum, 45, wife of Abdus Samad, Sudipta Paul Shelly, 28, organising secretary of Netrakona Udichi, and one unidentified JMB man.

Though three years have passed, no victims of the blast got any compensation nor any officials visited them.

During a visit to the house of Shahnaz Begum, 30, wife of Khwaja Haider, this correspondent came to know that her family did not get any financial help from the government.

"No minister, even the local Khwaja Haider

did not visit my house, " she came to console them, they

children named Siplu, 13, and Saon,5, while her mother-inlaw also lives with them. "We have become helpless

after the death of Haider as he was the only earning member of the family" she added. When asked Shahnaz said,

"I do not want any help from the government because of its failure to punish the culprits who were involved in the killing."

Sudipta Paul also was the lone earning member of her family. After her death her old parents Sushil Paul, 65, and Aruna Paul, 55, along with her 'sick' brother have become totally helpless.

They did not get any help from the government, and no added. During a visit this corre-

spondent found Aruna Paul suffering from disease but unable to buy medicine for want of money. This correspondent also

visited the houses of other victims Rani Begum, Joinal, Raisuddin, Yadav Das and Jahanara and talked to their family members. All of them told similar tales.

On February 17, the Speedy Tribunal Court-2 Dhaka sentenced three suicidal JMB men to death for their involvement in the bomb blast.

They were Salah Uddin, Asaduzzaman and Yunus. But the verdict was not

implemented yet. On the other hand, police

have failed to arrest Yunus.

tasks relentlessly. Terming the CHT a place of different ethnic and Bangalee people, Moeen said around nine lakh people -- both indigenous and Bangalee -- are living peace-

Engineers Construction Battalion (ECB) is implementing those road development projects. The 130.02-metre bridge at Ranirhat was constructed by ECB-16 at a cost of Tk 8.30 crore.




