

Magnetic chip to be given for security

The government is to provide a magnetic chip card to all migrant workers going abroad for work as part of new initiatives to ensure their security and rights while working abroad.

Director General of the Bureau of Manpower Employment and Training (BMET) Mohammad Abdul Malek yesterday said that the card is being developed under a six-month project undertaken by the government recently.

Each card will contain data about the worker, including details of the recruiting agency through which he secured the job contract, and this information would make it easier for them to get legal or social support abroad.

Speaking at a dialogue at the BIAM auditorium in the city, Malek said the magnetic card would make the process of migration smoother and more secure.

"The message must go to Bangladesh that it was dutybound... it cannot allow its territory to be a safe haven for the insurgent groups," Indian Home Minister P Chidambaram said in the Lok Sabha.

"In the long run, Bangladesh is hurting itself if it does not enjoy good relations with India," he said winding SEE PAGE 15 COL 3


