

The former national batsman made 27 off 52 balls with a couple of boundaries and a six but found the gloves of Ashiqul Islam off a Niaz Morshed delivery.

That made way for Mohammad Rahi, who played a dour but effective knock of 71 off 88

balls. The innings had eight boundaries and the batsman who played for First Division side Bangladesh Boys last season added 80 for the sixth wicket with Abahani's reserve wicketkeeper Kuntal Chandra (20).

Morshed was Shaheed Mushtaque XI's best bowler, picking up three for 31 with his gentle pace and swing.
