SC lawyers fight it out in ballots

With clean personality and family glory of Bangabandhu, Awami League-led grand alliance's Sheikh Fazle Noor Taposh is ready for a tough battle with BNP's previous lawmaker Khandaker Mahabub Uddin Ahmed in Dhaka-12 constituency.

Voters in the area said although eight candidates are contesting from the seat in the December 29 parliamentary election, the main fight would be between the two lawyers--one experienced and the other fresh--who hail from Gopalganj.

Dhaka-12 consists of Dhanmondi residential area, Hazaribagh tannery area, New Market, Kalabagan, Jigatola and Green Road areas with 2,60,859 vot-

ers of which 1,14,844 are women. In the last election these areas were under Dhaka-9 along with areas under Mohammadpur Police Station.

Taposh is the son of Bangabandhu

Sheikh Mujibur Rahman's nephew Sheikh Fazlul Haque Moni who was assassinated on August 15, 1975 along with Bangabandhu and his family. Taposh is one of the lawyers who represented AL President Sheikh Hasina in many cases.

Talking to The Daily Star Khorshed Alam, a middle-aged voter in the constituency, said, "Taposh has a clean personality and he is young, which would give him more advantage. Being a member of Bangabandhu's family will also help

No intensive care for burns

Fund, equipment available, yet the unit fails to take off in 7 years for manpower shortage

Garment worker Sumi, 28, who struggled for 18 days with burn injures sustained in a collision between a bus and an acid-laden truck on Dhaka-Chittagong highway in Comilla on November 6, died without receiving intensive care.

As the Burn and Plastic Surgery Unit of Dhaka Medical College Hospital (DMCH) has no operational Intensive Care Unit (ICU), critical burn patients like Sumi, Faysal and others had to die without receiving the care they deserved.

About 15 patients out of 190 receiving treatment at the unit need intensive care, said hospital authorities.

"Those who receive 40 to 60 percent burns in their bodies require intensive care. Unfortunately we are yet to make the eight-bed ICU operational at the burn unit despite having modern equipment and funding," said Shamantalal Sen, project director of the unit.

Equipment worth more than Tk 2 crore run the well-equipped ICU in five years due to lack of manpower. The ICU is equipped with ventilator, Pulse Oxymetre, cardiac monitor and blood analyser.

"We tried to run the ICU twice as we has been lying idle at the ICU since its, receive three to four patients every day who inception in 2003. The authorities failed to need intensive care. In ICU every patient should have a nurse dedicated to him or her. We do not have enough manpower for general beds even, how can we run the ICU with such an insignificant number of nurses

50pc driving licence fake, admits BRTA

Govt faces Tk 20cr loss due to BRTA graft in last 5 years

About 50 percent of driving licences carried by drivers across the country are fake and prepared through irregularities and corruption, says the chairman of Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA).

Not only the fraudsters, a section of staffs of BRTA and the Ministry of Communications are also are providing drivers with fake licences.

The government faced a loss of Tk 20 crore in revenue income in the last five years due to corruption at BRTA.

These were revealed by BRTA Chairman Sunil Kanti Bosh at a views exchange meeting between the communications ministry and the Anti-Corruption Commission (ACC) yesterday. "Fifty percent of the licences available with the drivers were

not issued by BRTA," Sunil told the meet.

When the BRTA chairman reveals such information people have no other choices but commuting, even walking on the footpaths, every day knowing that their lives depend on unskilled and unregistered drivers.

Not only BRTA, the Roads and Highways Department (RHD) under the communications ministry is also infested with such level of corruption.

The government staffs in these offices often resort to excuses and seldom carry out their duties to commit illegal activities. A single example could clarify how irresponsible and ineffi-

cient the government staffs are regarding their duties. Communications Secretary Iqbal Mahmud has recently sent emails to 250 RHD staffs seeking the status of an ongoing project.

Surprisingly, the secretary received only three replies, while the rest 247 engineers gave an unbelievable excuse. They said they could not reply due to "password difficulties".

3 lakh cases pending Public investment, ADP major challenges

Mirza Aziz unveils 16 tasks for next govt

Finance and Planning Adviser Mirza Azizul Islam yesterday identified 16 challenges for the next government in the context of present global situation and said as the country's economic base is strong it would be possible to face those.

"Possible onslaught can be faced with the level of overall economic condition of the country now," Mirza Aziz said at a press briefing at the National Economic Council (NEC) conference centre at Sher-e-Bangla Nagar.

Listing the challenges for the next government, Mirza Aziz stressed that public investment has to be increased. The Planning Commission and the IMED will have to take immediate steps to strengthen implementation of the ADP.

He said public investment in power and energy sector has to be increased, the money saved from import subsidy on fuel may be invested in power sector and the on-going social safety net programmes should be continued in 2009-2010.

Subsidy in pubic sector has to be cut, and there should be public-private joint management.

The adviser said without hampering

Lawmakers in Pakistan yesterday condemned what they called India's "unsubstantiated" allegations against Islamabad over the Mumbai attacks and called for the neighbours to conduct a joint probe. Federal MPs also called for an end to "war hype" whipped up

between the nuclear-armed South Asian countries following last month's attacks, which New Delhi has blamed on a banned Pakistan-based militant group, Lashkar-e-Taiba. "The National Assembly of Pakistan condemns unsubstanti-

ated allegations levelled in haste against Pakistan," the lawmakers said in a resolution approved unanimously after a week-long general debate on national security.

The resolution called upon India "to respond to the constructive proposals made by the government of Pakistan, namely joint investigations and high-level engagement with a view to SEE PAGE 15 COL 7
