Anti-Jamaat sentiment in BNP makes grand alliance stronger

BNP candidates in a number of constituencies in Rajshahi division are unlikely to achieve any gains despite support of its key alliance partner Jamaat-e-Islami due to widening rift and anti-Jamaat sentiment in BNP.

Moreover, the vote tally of past elections and the raising demands for resisting war criminals suggest that Jamaat candidates in at least a dozen constituencies, out of total 18 seats where Jamaat-e-Islami has its nominees in the northern region, are likely to see their grand alliance contestants to be stronger.

In three constituencies Chapainawabganj-3, Rajshahi-3 and Sirajganj-4, Jamaat members may pave the way for grand alliance candidates who are also plagued by Awami League candidates' rebellion at some five constituencies Dinajpur-6, Nilphamari-4, Rangpur-4, 5 and Kurigram 4. Strong battle is expected between grand alliance and Jamaat nominees at Pabna-1 and 5 constituencies.

Taking advantage of the situations, grand alliance candidates are expecting to win a record number of seats in the 16 districts of the division where there are 72 seats in the Jatiya Sangsad.

Four-party alliance leader and BNP Chairperson Khaleda Zia is contesting from Bogra-6 and 7 constituencies while grand alliance's leader Sheikh Hasina will contest from Rangpur-6, Jatiya Party chairman HM Ershad from Rangpur-3 and Kurigram-2 and his wife Rawshan Ershad from Gaibandha-5 constituencies.

BNP's vital candidate Mizanur Rahman Minu at Rajshahi-2 is frustrated over his cold war with several party leaders.

The split between Minu and another BNP candidate Kabir Hossain at Rajshahi-3 is an open secret. It is believed widely by many BNP workers that Minu

had role behind Jamaat candidate Ataur Rahman's rebellion against Kabir at the latter's seat.

For Ataur's rebellion, Awami League candidate Miraj Uddin Mollah had chances at the constituency. On the other hand, Kabir followers' revenge against Minu can make the sail of grand alliance's Fazle Hossain Badsha over Minu easy at Rajshahi-2.

Apart from the group of former BNP lawmaker Nadim Mustafa, Minu is also having some distance with the group of Mosaddek Hossain Bulbul who lacked Minu's support during his August 4 mayoral contest against city mayor AHM Khairuzzaman Liton.

The group of Nadim Mustafa who is now fleeing abroad being convicted in several corruption and extortion cases has remained silent even during the last-minute campaign for BNP candidate Nazrul Islam at Rajshahi-5. Nadim is annoyed as he failed getting his wife nominated by BNP.

Many BNP men are frustrated over their political fate as in absence of jailed BNP deputy minister Ruhul Kuddus Talukdar Dulu, his wife Sabina Yasmin Chhobi was nominated at Natore-2 constituency.

BNP candidate Enamul Haque at Rajshahi-1 is also facing a strong grouping over local BNP's politics centring his family. Enamul was nominated in absence of his brother Barrister Aminul Haque who is now abroad after being convicted in a militancy case.

Some BNP nominees including Jatiya Sangsad speaker Barrister M Jamiruddin Sarker, Asadul Habib Dulu in Lalmonirhat-3, Shahjahan Mia of Chapainawabganj-1, Harunur Rashid in Chapainawabganj-3, Fazlur Rahman Patal in Natore-1, Kazi Golam Morshed in Natore-2, Muzammel Haque in Natore-4 and M Shokrana of Bogra are contesting amid similar problems.

However, although Rajshahi is a

stronghold of BNP-Jamaat, the alliance is now facing an image crisis as the voters as a number of its party leaders are facing charges for graft and abetting militancy.

"The splits in party and above all, BNP's alliance with Jamaat are not tolerable to many party workers like me. If BNP were not allied with Jamaat, perhaps, we would not have to be known as militancy abettors", said a BNP leader asking for anonymity.

"The BNP split in Rajshahi region are more or less due to BNP leaders' loyalty to Jamaat-e-Islami. BNP in many places lost supremacy since the fundamentalists' role", said a BNP leader of Rajshahi-1 constituency who was able to avail BNP nomination this year.

He argued that Barrister Aminul Haque phoned from abroad to Jamaat-e-Islami Ameer Matir Rahman for leaving Rajshahi-1 constituency for his brother, not to any BNP leaders. The phone call was made while Nizami was on a visit to Rajshahi and Chapainawabganj, confirmed a Jamaat candidate at Chapainawabganj-3 Latifur Rahman.

Several BNP leaders at northern districts including Natore and Rajshahi echoed the anonymous BNP men.

However, deputy speaker Akhtar Hamid Siddiki in Naogaon-3 and Mirza Fakrul Islam Alamgir at Thakurgaon-3, Jamaat Ameer Matir Rahman Nizami at Pabna-1 and ABM Abdus Subhan Mia at Pabna-5 are likely to have strong fight with grand alliance candidates.

AL's Asaduzzaman was contesting with Jamaat's M Moniruzzaman at Nilphamari-2, Noor won the 2001 election by 2 percent votes without the support of Jatiya Party that bagged 22 percent votes.

Jamaat won Nilphamari-3 seat by over 5 percent votes in 2001, but this time JP's Kazi Faruk Quader is a stronger candidate with Awami League support.

16 injured in pre-poll violence

Sixteen people were injured in electoral clashes in Rajshahi and Barisal in last two days.

Our Rajshahi correspondent reports: Two activists of Awami League were seriously injured as BNP cadres attacked the procession of grand alliance candidate Omar Faruk Chowdhury in Rajshahi-1 constituency at Tikorpara village under Godagari upazila in Rajshahi on Saturday night.

The injured were identified as Zubul, 23 and Zahid, 50. The injured were admitted at Godagari Health Complex.

Locals said BNP cadres attacked AL leaders and activists when they brought out a procession at Tikorpara village at 11:00pm. BNP cadres attacked the AL procession with bamboo sticks and throw bricks when the procession reach in front of the BNP election campaign office. They also damaged AL election campaign office, banners, posters and electoral symbols.

Later, police rushed to the spot and brought the situation under control. A huge number of police were deployed there to avert further incident.

On the other hand, at least 10 people were injured in a clash between the activists of grand alliance candidate Engineer Enamul Haque and independent candidate Sarder Amzad Hossain in Rajshahi-4 constituency.

The injured were treated at Bagmara health complex.

Our correspondent from Barisal adds: K M Shahidullah, commissioner of ward-12 of Barisal City Corporation (BCC) and panel mayor of BCC, was injured as Shaiful Alam Gulzar, former district unit treasurer of BNP, who recently joined of ward-11, allegedly beat him centreing electoral campaign early yesterday.

The 16 pro-BNP ward commissioners of BCC in a press conference at a restaurant in the city yesterday said the attack happened following participation of huge number of people from the ward of Gulzar in an electoral campaign organised by Shahidullah.

JAMUNA BRIDGE APPROACH ROAD: A DEATH TRAP

Road crashes claim 1500 in 10 yrs

The road from Jamuna bridge to Mirzapur in Tangail has become a death trap due to widespread violation of traffic rules and insufficient space for movement of large number of vehicles.

At least 1,500 people were killed and 3,500 others injured in about 1,250 road accidents on the highway after the inauguration of the Jamuna bridge in 1998, Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) and police sources said.

Violation of traffic rules, plying of unfit vehicles carrying passengers on the roof, insufficient space for vehicular movement, inefficient drivers and reckless driving are the main reasons behind the increasing number of road accidents on the highway, they added.

A total 24 labourers travelling on an iron rod-laden truck were killed yesterday morning as the truck skidded off the road and fell into a roadside ditch at Kandila in Tangail after the driver lost control due to dense fog.

Earlier on November 1 last, at least 10 day-labourers mostly rickshaw-pullers traveling by a fertilizer-laden truck were killed as the truck plunged into a ditch by the highway at Pouli in

Kalihati upazila.

On April 19 last, at least 18 people were killed as a bus skidded off the highway and fell on the nearby railway track at Hatia in the same upazila.

Just three days before the accident, about 17 cloth traders were killed in a collision between a bus and a train at Rajabari rail crossing in the same upazila.

A total of 20 people were killed as a bus fell into the Pouli river breaking the railings of the Pouli bridge in the same upazila

on April 24, 2005.

Besides, about 21 day-labourers were killed after a cement-laden truck carrying them swerved off the highway and fell into a ditch at Ashkepur the same year.

The Jamuna bridge was inaugurated on July 23, 1998. Since then around 5,000 vehicles including buses and trucks have been crossing it to and from 16 northern and five southwestern districts everyday.

Although highway police

had been deployed to ensure safety on the highway, they do not perform their duties properly, Tangail Transport Owners' Association sources alleged.

Highway police, however, told The Daily Star that the number of accidents is on the rise, as it is not wide enough for the movement of huge number of vehicles.

There have also been allegations that most of the time drivers are not penalised for reckless driving.

Road accidents kill four

At least four people were injured and seven others injured in separate road accidents in Comilla and Gaibandha yesterday.

A CORRESPONDENT from Comilla reports: At least three people, including a minor girl, were killed and seven others injured in a road accident on Comilla-Shyhet bypass road in Moynamoti area in Sadar upazila yesterday.

The dead were identified as Md Murshad, 20, of Gonjor village under Muradnagar upazila, Md Mohsin, 35, of

Motlab upazila and Raziya, 3, of Gotiyara under Brahmanbaria district.

Police said the accident occurred at about 11:30am when a Shyhet-Bound passenger bus collided head-on with a Comilla-bound CNG-run taxi, leaving three dead on the spot and seven others injured. The critically injured were rushed to Comilla hospitals and Cantonment Hospital.

The bodies were sent to Comilla Medical College Hospital for autopsy.

OUR CORRESPONDENT from Gaibandha adds: An NGO official was killed in a road

accident on Gaibandha-Sunderganj road yesterday.

The victim identified as Rezaul Karim, 32, a field official of NGO TMSS of village Gopal under Pirgachha upazila.

The accident when motorcycle of Rezaul was crushed under the wheel of a Sunderganj-bound BRIC bus at Jaramnadi when he was going to his office at Shovaganj, leaving him injured seriously.

Rezaul succumbed to his injuries on the way to Rangpur Medical College Hospital.

The driver and helper of the bus, however, managed to escape.
