The syndicate, the highest-decision making body of the university, asked the authorities concerned to relieve the accused teachers of all examination-related activities in the department. When contacted late last night, Prof Azad told

The Daily Star that they would investigate the allegations brought by the fact-finding committee and recommend punitive action if the charges leaked it. are proved.
