Say scientists

Cultivation of hybrid rice varieties with imported seeds is spreading fast across the country for better harvest although these varieties require higher amount of being questioned but the goal should not inputs and degrade agricultural land.

The government is encouraging cultivation of hybrid rice ignoring the fact that huge import of these sterile varieties will make farmers dependent on multinational seed companies, experts said.

Hybrid varieties of foreign seeds demand more fertilisers, pesticides and water, firstly because these are high yielding and secondly because these are not developed to thrive in local climate conditions, scientists said.

As the population of microbes does not increase due to application of more chemical fertilisers and pesticides, soil loses water-storing capacity resulting in drought-like situation in many parts of the country, he said.
