Michael Hussey has seen no signs from Matthew Hayden that he is about to retire and would be stunned if the opener was not part of next month's tour to South Africa. Hayden scored 39 in the second innings to continue his horrible run at home this season amid increasing pressure to call time on his 103-Test career.

Hussey was in the dressing room when Hayden returned from his final five-day innings in Australia -- he has talked about bowing out in England next year -- after being bowled trying to heave Morne Morkel over midwicket. "He was fine," Hussey said. "I was padding up when he came in, sometimes he comes in calm, sometimes he's not so calm. He put his gear down and didn't say too much."

Steve Harmison has become the first England squad player to speak out on the rift between Peter Moores and Kevin Pietersen, urging the pair to sort out their differences for the good of the team.

Often happier to stay away from media attention, Harmison said the issue is not about individuals and any split in the camp will tear the team

"They have got to get their heads together and have a chat and sort out the issues," he told BBC Sport. "It's about the England cricket team -- not Peter Moores or Kevin Pietersen.

"It's not ideal at this moment in time because we are at the start of an Ashes summer and we don't want it to go on and on with what we've got coming over the next nine months. They will come and go like all other players, but they have got to be in harmony because otherwise New Zealand and West Indies never at the very top."

Djokovic sent crashing

Little-known Latvian Ernests Gulbis sent top seed and world number three Novak Djokovic crashing out of the first round of the Brisbane International here Tuesday.

Gulbis outplayed the inconsistent Djokovic to notch up a 6-4, 6-4 win in 90 minutes and open up the top half of the draw. Djokovic's woes were in

stark contrast to the performance of second-seeded Frenchman Jo-Wilfried Tsonga, who cruised to a 6-2, 7-5 win over Agustin Calleri of Argentina.

Djokovic, who defeated Tsonga in the final of last year's Australian Open, never looked early in the second set it was no comfortable on the centre court of the new Queensland Tennis Centre.

He only arrived in Australia on Saturday and said his lack of practice along with a change of rackets had contributed to the "I didn't play at all good

Vettori wants adding third **Indian Test**

New Zealand cricket captain Daniel Vettori said Tuesday he is excited by the prospect of adding a third Test to India's tour starting in March.

Ratnakar Shetty, chief administrative officer of the Board of Control for Cricket in India (BCCI), confirmed Monday that India had asked New Zealand to schedule an extra Test to offset losses after the cancellation of India's matches against England and Pakistan.

A spokesman for New Zealand Cricket said Tuesday a decision on India's request was likely to be made this week.

Vettori said a third Test would make a series result more likely.

"I'm pretty excited," he told reporters. "I think most players have been crying out for that third test match style series.

"It gives an opportunity for one team to win the series and probably makes it a little bit more interesting.

"The fact it's India, and the fact they're one of the best teams in the world at the moment... I think everyone would love to make it happen.'

Three Bangladeshi stars on Cricinfo Awards list

Graeme Smith, Virender Sehwag, Sachin Tendulkar, Ajantha Mendis and Dale Steyn were the cream of the crop in the nominations for the Cricinfo Awards, which recognise the best performances in Tests and ODIsin 2008. South Africa were clearly the

best Test team of the year with a 11-2 win-loss record, and that dominance is reflected in the nominations, with four out of ten shortlisted batting performances. Their captain leads the way: Smith has been nominated for both his match-winning centuries in fourth-innings runchases -- an unbeaten 154 against England at Edgbaston and 108 against Australia in the 166 in Melbourne, and AB de Villiers are the other two South Africans. Virender Sehwag is the only other batsman with two nominations in this category, for his double-hundred in Galle and the utterly spectacular 83 against England in Chennai, the only non-century in the shortlist.
