Inmates lead sub-human Profile of ministers, state ministers life at govt vagrant centre

Inmates live in sub-human condition at government vagrant reception centre at Mirpur in the city due to sheer neglect of the authorities con-

cerned. In 1995, the public works department declared the building of the centre at Section-1 abandoned, but the vagrants are still brought and left there to stay

at the risk of their life. At present around 90 inmates are living at the centre, and of them 50 are staying at the safe custody of the authorities, and

the rest are living as vagrants. According to The Vagrancy Act 1943, the centre is to rehabilitate beggars and physically and mentally challenged people, and provide training to them so that

they can earn their own liveli-





Rezaul Karim Hira


Land Minister Rezaul Karim Hira was born on December 1 in 1942 in Jamalpur district.

Minister for CHT Affairs Dipankar Talukder was born on December 12, 1952 at Rangamati Sadar upazila.


Dipankar completed his matriculation from Bandarban Govt High School in 1968 and HSC from Dhaka College in 1971. He did his honours degree in English from Dhaka


politics of Bangladesh Chhatra League since his student life and became its president.


