During that period fertilisers used to be sold on open markets through dealers, which was later stopped by the last BNP-Jamaat alliance government.

We want to ensure uninterrupted supply of fertiliser to farmers according to our election pledges," said the commerce minister.

The cabinet also decided to continue the drive against terrorism and other criminal activities. Referring to different violent activities in different parts of the country in recent times, the meeting directed law enforcers to deal with those with an iron hand.

The meeting directed the law enforcers to ensure the security of peoples' lives and property, and to ensure peaceful situation and law and order in educational institutions across the country at any cost. It directed different intelligence agencies to be more active in that regard.

The decision to reduce the price of diesel came due to frequent power outages all across the country. Sources in the cabinet said the meeting observed that there is no alternative to reducing the price of diesel if agricultural production is to be increased for having a food surplus.

Government sources hinted that a reduced price of diesel might come into effect in a day
