

ISI hands Mumbai information to India

US Vice President-elect in Islamabad for talks

Pakistan's main spy agency has given India information about the Mumbai terror attacks, the prime minister said yesterday, while denying media speculation of a rift between him and the president.

The comments came as US Vice Presidentelect Joe Biden arrived in Pakistan for talks with the country's top military and political leaders. The US Embassy confirmed the visit but gave

few details. The US has an interest in the stability of Pakistan's civilian government which is considered weak because of its support of the

American-led war on terror. There are multiple centers of power within the government, and the military and the Inter-Services Intelligence spy agency are believed to have significant independence.

2 judges to be appointed soon to dispose of case

Two judges may be appointed to the Appellate Division of the Supreme Court this week as per the recommendations of the Supreme Judicial Commission, paving the way for the disposal of long pending Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman murder case.

Top Qaeda operatives killed in Pakistan

The head of al-Qaeda in Pakistan and his lieutenant were killed in the past days, a US counterterrorism official told AFP on Thursday, repor edly struck by a missile fired from an unmanned drone.

The men are believed to be Kenyan national Usama al-Kini, described as al-Qaeda's chief of operations in Pakistan, and his lieutenant Sheikh Ahmed Salim Swedan, said the source, speaking on condition of anonymity.

"There is every reason to believe that these two top terrorist figures are dead," said the source, adding that the pair was killed "within the last week."

Officials believe al-Kini was behind the September 2008 truck bombing of Islamabad's Marriott Hotel that killed 60 people, and is linked to a failed assassination attempt on late Pakistani prime minister Benazir Bhutto.

Strike sparks fuel crisis in India

Petrol stations in cities across India ran dry today as a strike for better pay by state oil employees entered a third day and talks with the government broke down.

"We had some discussions but we are yet to reach a conclusion," Sarthak Behuria, the chairman of Indian Oil Corporation told reporters after overnight talks with the petroleum minister.

More than 45,000 employees at government-run oil companies halted work Wednesday to press for higher pay.

Petrol stations in many cities put up signs saying they had run out of stock, while motorists formed huge queues outside other filling stations.

Stolen cars sold between Tk 1-2 lakh each in city

Stolen cars are sold between Tk 1 and 2 lakh each while a stolen motorbike costs Tk 25,000 to 35,000 on the black market in and around the capital.

The car thieves with the help of a section of Bangladesh Road Transport Authority (BRTA) officials even provide the buyer with fake papers and duplicate number plates.

Dhaka Metropolitan Police (DMP) sources said over 1,000 motor vehicles including car, motorbike and CNG-run auto-rickshaws were stolen in

During the period, the DMP recovered over 250 stolen vehicles while over 300 people were arrested in connection with the thefts across

"We think it's important for democracy in South Asia that you have these types of elections," Robert Wood, deputy spokesman, told a regular press briefing in Washington on Thursday.

Replying to a question on what would be the US role after the elections in Bangladesh, he said the US wants to see this type of thing continue to happen in South Asia, "which, as you know, unfortunately has some problems with stability. So, that's how I'd characterise it."

President Iajuddin Ahmed and Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina issued separate messages on the occasion.


