



#### Hillary declares 'new era' for America

Hillary Clinton took charge Thursday of US foreign policy proclaiming a "new era for America" based on robust diplomacy and a fresh unity of purpose.

"I believe with all my heart that this is a new era for America," a beaming Hillary told a welcoming party of hundreds at the State Department following her Senate confirmation Wednesday as the 67th secretary of state.

Hillary, the wife of former US president Bill Clinton, faces unfinished wars in Iraq and Afghanistan, the troubled Middle East peace process, climate change, conflicts in Africa and efforts to revamp a tarnished US image.

"I think this is a time of such potential and possibility. I don't get up in the morning just thinking about the threats and the dangers, as real as they are. I also think what we can do," said Hillary.

## AL, BNP hold parliamentary party meet tomorrow

Awami League (AL) and BNP will have their parliamentary party meetings before inauguration of the ninth parliament tomorrow.

The newly elected legislature will convene at 3:00pm at the Jatiya Sangsad Bhaban. President Iajuddin Ahmed will address the opening session.

At the first sitting, parliament shall elect a speaker and a deputy speaker. It might also elect a successor to Iajuddin.

The AL Parliamentary Party (ALPP) meeting will begin at 2:00pm at a JS conference room. It will be chaired by Prime Minister and Leader of the House Sheikh Hasina.

BNP Chairperson and Leader of the Opposition Khaleda Zia will preside over the BNP Parliamentary Party (BNPP) meeting.

Party leader Salauddin Quader Chowdhury last night told The Daily Star that they will select a deputy leader and a chief whip of the opposition shortly before parliament goes into session.

Meanwhile, BNP yesterday demanded that the traditional seating arrangements in parliament not be changed.

# Obama rips down Bush security, foreign policies

Picks seasoned, high-powered envoys to ME, Afghanistan and Pakistan

US President Barack Obama on Thursday picked two seasoned and high-powered envoys to the Middle East and Afghanistan and Pakistan, making another swift break with Bush administration policy.

In an aggressive push for peace in the world's most intractable hot spots, Obama named Northern Ireland peacemaker George Mitchell for the Middle East and Balkans mediator Richard Holbrooke for both Afghanistan and Pakistan.

Flanked by the two envoys and Secretary of State Hillary Clinton, Obama told diplomats at the State Department that he was summoning the pair to "convey our seriousness of purpose" in light of "the urgency and complexity of the challenges we face."

Hillary Clinton added that "anything short of relentless diplomatic efforts will fail to produce a lasting, sustainable peace in either

Obama's choice of two such respected and high-profile envoys signaled a new engagement in global affairs by his administration -and a break with the policy of former president George W.Bush who resisted such a step.

However, there was little sign Obama would drop the Bush administration's hard line toward the Hamas Islamist movement when he backed Israel's offensive in the Gaza Strip as a defense against Hamas rocket fire.

The new president also called on Israel to open Gaza border crossings to aid and commerce to help ease the plight of Palestinians.

Obama said he was sending Mitchell to the region as soon as possible to help shore up a fragile ceasefire that took hold last weekend after a three-week Israeli offensive left more than 1,330 Palestinians and 13 Israelis dead.

"It will be the policy of my administration to actively and aggressively seek a lasting peace

## RAJUK MISSES DEADLINE

## Uttara third phase plots to be allotted in June

The Rajdhani Unnayan Kartripakkha (Rajuk) will start distributing the plots under Uttara Model Town third phase from June this year, instead of this month, as 20 percent work of land filling is still incomplete.

Missing its previous deadline, the Rajuk tried to extend the project time by one more year and has already got approval in principle in this regard from the housing and public works ministry, said an official.

Project Director of Uttara third phase Nurul Islam said they would start handing over plots from June and try to hand over all plots within this year. "We have already done 80 percent work of land filling and we are trying our best to

complete rest of the work by June 31," he said. The Rajuk website however still announces that handing over of plots in Uttara sectors 15 18 will start this month.

Meanwhile, another Rajuk official expressed doubts about the timeframe for completing the land filling work in two of the 59 sections because the process for the work is yet to begin.

The whole project area has been divided into several sections for different types of work: 59 sections for land filling and 32 sections for road construction, for example.

The road construction work in six sections will start shortly while the processes for the rest are at different stages now, said the official. Thirteen bridges will be constructed on the

## 'Thieves looked for something valuable but illegal'

The break-in at Bangladesh Railway (BR) headquarters on Saturday night was not an incident of mere theft. Criminals broke into the office rooms to take away something that is "valuable butillegal"

Besides this finding, the probe committee formed by the communications ministry suspects that the incident might have been carried out by a vested interest group to damage the image of the government.

However, the confession of Enamul Hug Khokan, who was arrested by the Detective Branch (DB), contradicts the probe committee report. Khokan told the DB that they broke into the BR office only to steal money and valuables. Earlier on Tuesday, the communications

secretary and BR director general also described the incident as theft and said nothing but some money, four mobile phones and a laptop computer were stolen.

Talking to The Daily Star, head of the probe body Joint Secretary Nasrin Akter yesterday said, "It is sure that the criminals did not ransack 56 rooms for just Tk 92,000, four mobile phones and a laptop computer.

"They had a different mission and we suspect they were looking for something highly precious but illegal kept in one of the rooms. As the criminals did not know its specific location they ransacked 56 rooms," she said.

"We suspect that some illegal objects or documents might have been removed from the railway office before the looters broke in,"

## Massive aid needed for Gaza: UN

The world will need to donate hundreds of million of dollars for Gaza to repair greater than expected destruction by the Israeli offensive on the territory, the UN humanitarian chief said yes-

"It will involve a very significant appeal for resources of hundreds of millions of dollars to address short term needs perhaps for the next six or nine months," John Holmes told a press con-


"The level of destruction, which I expected to be high ... was even worse than what I expected," he said after touring Gaza.

"What is perhaps even more important than the physical destruction is the human cost," he said. The Palestinian health ministry listed more than 1,300 dead and 5,000 wounded during Israel's 22-day Operation Cast Lead.

The world body would in early February make an appeal for international funds to meet the most urgent needs, he said. Meanwhile, the head of the UN relief agency for Palestinian

Britain is in recession for the first time since 1991, official data showed yesterday, triggering a plea from Prime Minister Gordon Brown for renewed international help to tackle the financial crisis.

The Office for National points. Statistics (ONS) said that gross domestic product (GDP) had shrunk by 1.5 percent in the British economy recovered. fourth quarter of 2008 compared with the previous threemonth period, when it con-

tracted by 0.6 percent. The generally-used technical definition of a recession is two quarters running of negative economic growth.

The figure for the final quarter of 2008 showed the biggest fall in GDP since 1980. Brown said on Friday he was using "every weapon at

our disposal" to fight the economic crisis. "But we need the international co-operation as well,"

he told BBC radio. Friday's data sent the British pound sliding to a 23year low versus the dollar and London's FTSE 100 index of top shares slid under 4,000

UK GDP to contract by 2.9 percent in 2009, with declines in output occurring through all four quarters," said Howard Archer of IHS Global Insight.


