Form special tribunal to try war criminals

Demand lawmakers

The lawmakers who defeated anti-liberation forces in the December 29 parliamentary elections yesterday called for forming a special tribunal immediately to try war criminals.

During the election, the entire nation got united in the demand for trial of war criminals, said lawmaker Shamsul Haque Tuku, who defeated Jamaat-e-Islami Ameer Matiur Rahman Nizami in the election.

"I was not aware of such a campaign against war criminals in my constituency in Pabna. Students and teachers of universities and cultural activists spearheaded the campaign urging the people to boycott war criminals in the election," he said at a reception ceremony.

Forum for Secular Bangladesh accorded a reception to 38 lawmakers, who defeated the anti-liberation forces in the election, at Supreme Court Bar Association auditorium in the city.

Solar eclipse tomorrow

An annular eclipse of the sun will occur tomorrow.

It will start at 10 hours 56 minutes 36 seconds BST and will end at 17 hours 00 minutes 42 seconds BST, said an ISPR press release.

The central eclipse will start at 12 hours 05 minutes 48 seconds BST and will end at 15 hours 51 minutes 36 seconds BST. The greatest eclipse will occur at 13 leburs 58 minutes 36 seconds BS

The magnitude of the greatest eclipse will be 0.929 and duration of the annular phase will be 7 minutes 51 seconds.

The eclipse will start at 05 hours 29 minutes 30 seconds LMT at the south-west of Namibian sea coast in the South Atlantic Ocean. It will end at 17 hours 59 minutes 42 seconds LMT at the south-western coast ofVietnam of Asia.

The central eclipse will start at 05 hours 18 minutes 44 seconds LMT at the north of Tristan da Comba island of Britain in the South Atlantic Ocean.

It will end at 18 hours 07 minutes 34 seconds LMT of the southwest of the Philippines of Asia in the Celebes sea.
