Dell seeks refuge in Poland as crisis bites

There is no joy among workers at Dell's factory here over the global computer giant's decision to shift production from Ireland to Poland but as the economic crisis bites they are relieved their jobs are safe.

"We understand it's a blow to people in Ireland -we Poles have also suffered high unemployment -- but it's difficult not to be a little bit selfish in this (economic) situation," says Bartosz, a 23-year-old Dell employee and IT student waiting for a bus home outside the vast plant after a shift.

As he gazes down from a balcony overlooking the factory's state-of-the-art assembly lines, Rafal Branowski, communications manager for Dell Poland, says it is unclear how many of the 1,900 Dell jobs lost in Limerick will come to Poland.

The size of five football pitches, the giant factory's three lines employ 1,800 people assembling built-toorder laptops using Asianmade components for clients in Europe, the Middle East and Africa. The decision to transfer

production from our Irish plant in Limerick here to Lodz and third parties is part of a plan to save three billion dollars," says Branowski.

Pressed, he admits at least one new production line for desk tops and servers creating upwards of 300-job is likely to begin operation within a year.

With salaries on the fac tory floor averaging 1,500 t 2,000 zlotys (345-460 euro 445-590 dollars) per month labour costs in Poland are fraction of those in Ireland.

Hundreds of Filipinos lose jobs daily

Hundreds of people in th Philippines are losing the jobs every day as the globa economy slows, Labou Secretary Marianito Roqu said Friday.

Between December 1 an January 19, some 15,60 workers were laid off, Roqu said in a radio interview.

Over the same period 19,000 others had their shift or working hours reduced. "Just for today it wa

reported to us that 458 peo ple nationwide could los their jobs," Roque said. He said most of the jo

cuts were happening in th electronics sector, which ha suffered from plungin global demand. The sector employs

480,000 people and accounts for nearly 70 per cent of Philippine exports. After US chip maker Intel

Corp announced the closure of a chip testing plant in Cavite province this week with the loss of 1,800 jobs, Roque warned that up to 60,000 Filipinos could lose their jobs this year, mainly in the electronics and garments industries.

Roque said he did not keep comparative figures for previous years, but stressed: This is not normal. This is not business as usual."
