A Palestinian was shot dead and an Israeli soldier reportedly killed in a blast yesterday as the deadliest flare-up since the end of the Gaza conflict cast a dark shadow over the new US peace envoy's maiden mission to the region.

US envoy predicts 'direct diplomacy' with Iran

President Barack Obama's administration will engage in "direct diplomacy" with Iran, the newly installed US ambassador to the United Nations said Monday.

Not since before the 1979 Iranian revolution are US officials believed to have conducted wideranging direct diplomacy with Iranian officials. But US Ambassador Susan Rice warned that Iran must meet UN Security Council demands to suspend uranium enrichment before any talks on its nuclear programme.

"The dialogue and diplomacy must go hand in hand with a very firm message from the United States and the international community that Iran needs to meet its obligations as defined by the Security Council. And its continuing refusal to do so will only cause pressure to increase," she told reporters during a brief question-and-answer

Her comments, reflecting Obama's signals for improved relations with America's foes after eight years under President George W Bush, came shortly after meeting with Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon on her first day in her new job.

Global warming 'irreversible' for next 1,000 years: Study

Climate change is "largely irreversible" for the next 1,000 years even if carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions could be abruptly halted, according to a new study led by the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA).

The study's authors said in certain regions. there was "no going back" after the report showed that changes in surface temperature, rainfall and sea level are "largely irreversible for more than 1,000 years after CO2 emissions are completely stopped."

NOAA senior scientist Susan Solomon said the study, published in this week's Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences journal, showed that current human choices on carbon dioxide emissions are set to "irreversibly change the planet."

Researchers examined the consequences of CO2 building up beyond present- supplies, increased fire freday concentrations of 385 quency, ecosystem change parts per million, and then and expanded deserts.


completely stopping emissions after the peak. Before the industrial age CO2 in Earth's atmosphere amounted to only 280 parts permillion.

The study found that CO2 levels are irreversibly impacting climate change, which will contribute to global sea level rise and rainfall changes

The authors emphasised that increases in CO2 that occur from 2000 to 2100 are set to "lock in" a sea level rise over the next 1,000 years.

Rising sea levels would cause "irreversible commitments to future changes in the geography of the Earth, since many coastal and island features would ultimately become submerged," the study said.

Decreases in rainfall that last for centuries can be expected to have a range of impacts, said the authors. Regional impacts include -but are not limited to -decreased human water
