companies. But the most

alluring side of becoming the khatib is the hadia (gifts) given by people at home and Chaired by Home Minister Sahara Khatun, the meeting also unanimously reached a consensus that the immediate past caretaker government chose the right person as the

khatib, who delivers sermon during Friday or Eid prayers. "Mosque is the holy place and no disorder there will be tolerated. Tough actions will be taken against troublemakers if they try again to create unrest," said State Minister for Home Affairs Tanjim Ahmed
