

Dhaka seeks US zero tariff facility

UNB, Dhaka

State Minister for Foreign Affairs Dr Hasan Mahmud yesterday sought duty and quota free access of Bangladeshi products including readymade garments to US market.

Mahmud made the request when former US assistant secretary of state for South Asia Karl F Inderfurth met with him at the Foreign Ministry.

They discussed Bangladesh-US bilateral relations focusing on development cooperation, trade, education and cultural exchange programmes.

On duty and quota free access of Bangladeshi products, Inderfurth who held the office of the Assistant Secretary of State for South Asia from 1997-2001 assured the state minister of his cooperation in this respect.

Mahmud said US is an important development partner of Bangladesh and an excellent bilateral relation exists between Dhaka and Washington.

Next budget to facilitate poverty cut: NBR chief

The government will formulate the next fiscal budget to facilitate poverty reduction and employment generation.

"Winning over poverty as the prime target, employment generation is the way to reduce poverty. To facilitate this, industrialisation that creates employment will be the prime philosophy for the next year's budget," said NBR chairman M Abdul Mazid at the first pre-budget meeting held at the NBR conference room yesterday.

The National Board of Revenue (NBR) started the month-long pre-budget meeting to get ideas and information from the major stakeholders.

Representatives from agriculture and poultry sectors were also present in yesterday's meeting.

The NBR chairman said the government would give facility in duty and tax to any investment in the business.

He said the import process of raw materials and capital machineries would be re-structured with a view to have expansion of national capital and a well-balanced welfare economy.

"There will be re-structuring of import duty on the basis of economical logic and we'll show reluctance for importing luxury and less-important items in the next budget," Mazid said.

He further said that the duty structure would be balanced on the basis of sector-wise items in the next budget and the implementation process will be introduced in right time and in the time when it is necessary.

The government, he added, will formulate an easier process to imposing tax, paying tax and collecting tax, and make the process pro-taxpayers and investment-friendly.

Mazid also mentioned that the philosophy of the next fiscal budget would be amendment of change in duty and tax related rules, regulations and policy. "Next year, the budget will be knowledge based, towards digital Bangladesh and charter for change."

He said the budget would be for ensuring social and distributive justice, participatory, client friendly and pro-business and pro-SMEs, minimising cost of doing business to curb price-hike.

The NBR chairman said they would expand the tax net next year not by imposing enhanced tax to generate revenue, chasing tax evaders not by harassing but intellectually motivating taxpayers and collectors to change the mindset and environment.

"We'll strengthen our monitoring, supervision and cross-checking system to net tax evaders," he said.

China vows rural support amid crisis

China will plough ahead with tough measures to develop rural areas and agriculture in 2009 despite expectations that this year will witness the hardest challenges of the last decade, the central government said Sunday.

A global resource market slump, increasing public concern about food safety and a fast-diminishing labour pool for rural migrant workers are among the most critical issues facing the Chinese countryside, according to the document, which was discussed at an annual central work conference in December and released Sunday.

As the first policy document of the year, it was issued jointly by the State Council and the Central Committee of the Communist Party of China to highlight the significance of agriculture to the nation.

"The development of agriculture and rural areas in 2009 is of special significance," it said.

Experts at the two-day forum will address such issues as basic necessities, energy, technology, sustainable environment, global SMEs and banking.

The forum, which will be

organised by the WIEF Foundation in cooperation with Indonesian government, aims to strengthen business cooperation between Muslim and non-Muslim businesspeople worldwide.

Over the recent years there has been an increase in trade and investment among Muslim countries initiated by forward thinking business communities, the statement said, adding that these countries are playing a proactive role in the global market.

The imbalance of devel-

opment progress within Islamic nations, with some countries more economically vibrant than others, suggests that there is a need for harmonisation of market. Trade liberalisation may be a way to combat the issue.

Economic interdependence will pave the way for greater progress among the countries. Efforts must be enhanced in areas such as investment, agriculture, energy, transportation, banking, finance, health, and science and technology, according to the statement.

EBL travel card launched

Eastern Bank Limited (EBL) yesterday launched "Travel Card", a prepaid Visa card for travellers, says a press release.

Ali Reza Iftikhar, the bank's chief executive officer, launched the service at a press conference at a city hotel.

"The card has been designed to give tourists a much better alternative of carrying cash and running after money exchange houses. This will also make the travellers free from the risk of counterfeit notes," said the bank.

The card will have a personal identification number for security purpose and there will be privilege of a free replacement, against lost or theft of the primary card. The card is reloadable in Bangladesh against the remaining individual travel quota without any extra fee.

Oil falls under \$45

Oil prices dropped Monday, falling below 45 dollars a barrel in London, as weak energy demand steered the market.

Brent North Sea crude for delivery in March slid 1.26 dollars to 44.62 dollars a barrel on London's InterContinental Exchange.

New York's main futures contract, light sweet crude for March, shed 1.30 dollars to 40.38 dollars a barrel.

"The demand really isn't there," said Jonathan Kornafel, Asia director of Hudson Capital Energy, adding there was a "supply glut" in US energy reserves.

Oil prices had edged higher on Friday following a milder than expected economic contraction in the United States and fears of a

strike crippling American refineries and pipelines, traders had said.

Government data last week showed the economy in the United States -- the world's biggest energy consumer -- had shrunk by 3.8 percent in the fourth quarter of 2008.

The economic contraction between October and December 2008 was the worst performance in 26 years and marked a sharp downward acceleration in economic activity after a 0.5 percent drop in the third quarter.

The United Steelworkers union meanwhile on Sunday agreed to extend talks on a new contract for thousands of workers at US refineries, averting a potentially crippling strike for now.
