

DCC hospitals in poor health

Lack manpower, equipment

Three hospitals run by Dhaka City Corporation (DCC) are unable to provide proper health service to patients--despite having proper budgetary allocations--because of lack of medical professionals and equipment.

Acute crisis of doctors and nurses has led to very poor service delivery at the Dhaka Sri Lanka spinner Muttiah Mahanagar General Hospital, Dhaka the hospital has had no surgeon on its payroll, Mahanagar Shishu Hospital and Nazirabazar severely hindering service. Maternity Hospital in the capital.

These hospitals were designed to provide

primary and secondary health care service to urban people.

A single patient was seen lying all by himself at a ward (surgery) at the 50-bed Dhaka Mahanagar General Hospital near Chawkbazar, while there were an insignificant number of patients at the other wards.

Public fund looters to be punished

here when he dismissed State minister tells JS about power sector graft during 4-party rule

The state minister for power and energy yesterday told the Jatiya Sangsad that legal actions should be taken against those who looted public money in the power sector during the immediate past BNP-led alliance government's tenure.

The alliance government spent Tk 13,512 crore in the sector and generated only 565 MW electricity. But the previous Awami League government had spent Tk 8,068 crore and generated 1,570 MW electricity, Shamsul Haque Tuku said.

"It means they (alliance men) looted public money in the power sector," he said replying to lawmakers' queries.

Lawmakers participating in the question-answer session demanded expansion of power supply network in their constituencies as per their election pledge.

In response, the state minister said the government has plans to build new power transmission lines to provide new electricity connection.

As forecast in the power system master plan in 2006, the expected demand for electricity will be 6,066 MW by 2009, 9,768 MW by 2015 and 13,993 MW by 2020.

To meet the urgent demand for electricity, the state minister informed the House, short-term measures are being taken. These include setting up independent power plants in Habiganj for generating 11 MW, in Feni for 33 MW, Ullapara 11 MW, Maona 33 MW, Barobkunda 22 MW, Rupganj 33 MW and in Jangalia for 33 MW within this year.

At present production of electricity stands at 4,000 MW SEE PAGE 15 COL 3


The number of books on the Liberation War brought out at the Ekushey Boi Mela so far this year has been very low.

Climate change must be tackled to avert crisis

Says UN chief

UN Secretary General Ban Ki-moon warned yesterday that failure to tackle climate change will lead to major economic upheaval, as he appealed to nations to reach agreement on carbon emission cuts.

"Deserts are spreading. Water scarcity is increasing. Tropical forests are shrinking. Our once prolific fisheries are in danger of collapse," said Ban at the start of a three-day conference in New Delhi on sustainable development. "Failure to combat climate change will increase poverty and

hardship. It will destabilise economies, breed insecurity in many countries and undermine our goals for sustainable development." All countries must strive to reach a "conclusive carbon emis-

sions reduction" deal in Copenhagen in December, he said at

the meeting. The gathering in the Danish capital is set to discuss initiatives

aimed at tackling climate change when the Kyoto Protocol expires in 2012.

"Copenhagen must clarify commitments of developed countries to reduce their emissions," said Ban, adding: "We must also SEE PAGE 15 COL 8

Somali pirates free Ukrainian arms ship Over \$3m ransom paid

Somali pirates yesterday freed a Ukrainian ship they had held since September with battle tanks and other weaponry on board after receiving a ransom of more than three million dollars.

The release of the ship and its crew of 20 seamen -- a Latvian, two Russians and 17 Ukrainians -- marked the end of one of the longest and most dramatic sea-jackings in since its capture on September 25, said more recent years.

"We have released MV Faina. There were only three boys remaining on board and they delayed the release for one hour, but now the ship is free," Sugule Ali, a spokesman for the pirates, told AFP by phone.

"The ship and the crew members are in good shape because our boys expended tremendous efforts to protect them. We fed them well."

Pirates in the town of Harardhere, off the coast of which the MV Faina had been held
